In the heart of Africa, west of Lake Victoria, is a strange land live in villages, known as Ankole. It is part of The Iro peopl

Uganda, a British colony or "protectorate. If you visited Ankole, you would

find few, if any, British residents. Almost all the people are negroes.

The negroes are divided into two classes, the masters and slaves. The masters are known as "Hima" and the slaves as "Iro." Far back, there seems to have been a mixture of foreign blood in the Hima stock. Invaders are believed to reached the region, probably com-ing from northern Africa.

The Hima own most of the longhorned cattle which graze about the high plains. Some of them follow the herds of cattle, but others

The Iro people are chiefly farmers, but some of them serve as car-penters, smiths and makers of pottery. On their farms they grow grain and other crops.

A person who wants a favor in Ankole is fortunate if he has the good will of the "mugabe." The mugabe is the big chief, or king, of the tribe, and controls the sale of property. From time to time he gives a stretch of land to some lesshave er chief.

The king's village has a fence around it. Most of the houses inside the fence are used by the royal family and servants. Made of mud and woven twigs, the houses amount to little from our viewpoint, but the natives think their ruler has a grand estate.

In the royal courtyard is a space set aside for two "holy drums." The natives say that these drums have magic powers. Spirits in them are supposed to bring good or evil to the kingdom.

No one dares to beat those cow-hide drums. Milk from a special herd of cows is placed beside them each day, and they are guarded by priests. The Ankole people talk about gods who are spirits of past kings.


