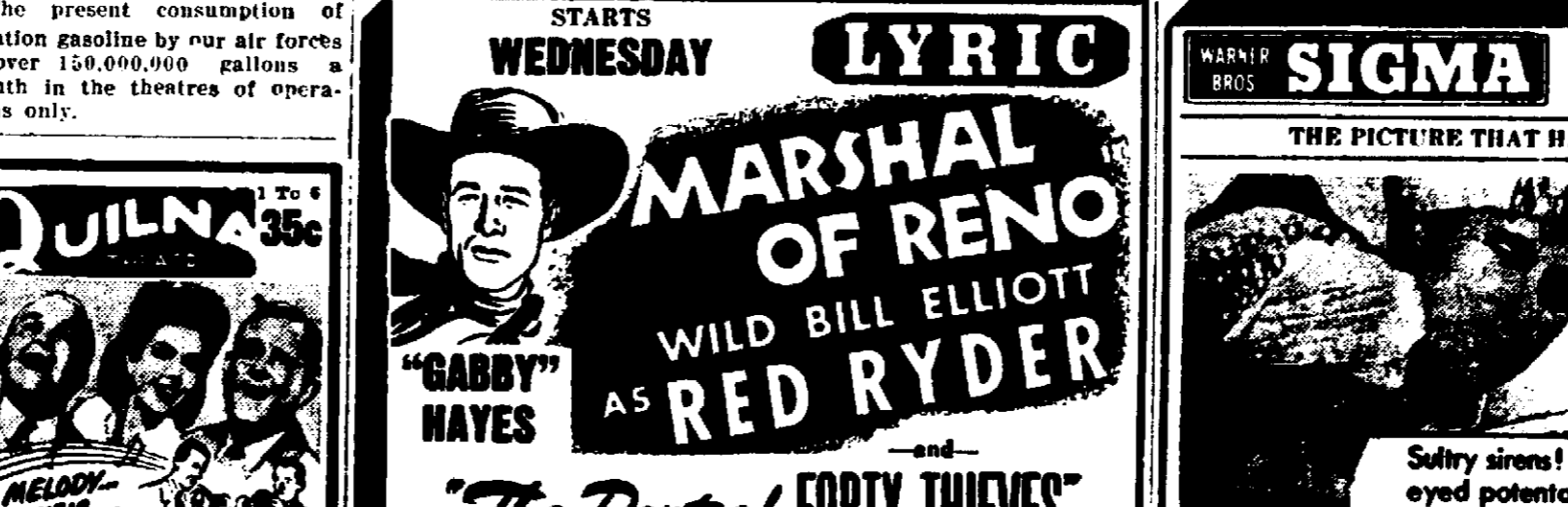
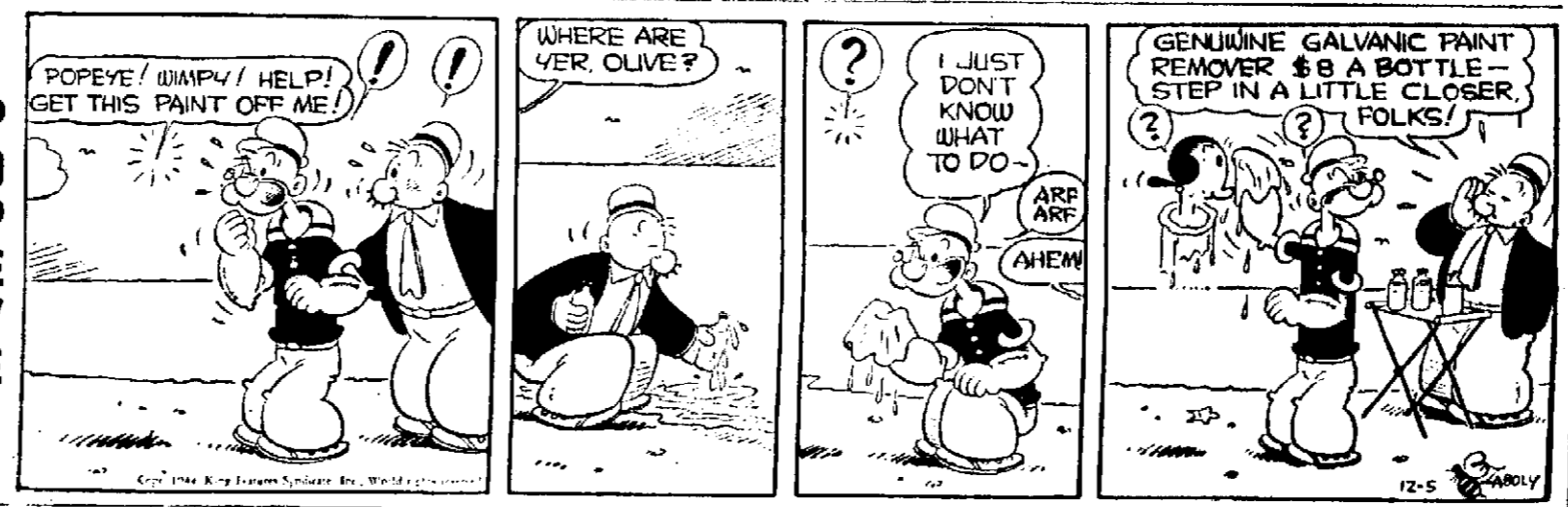

CLEVELAND, Dec. 5—(AP)—The National Labor Relations Board reported Saturday there would have to be a ruling on challenged votes before the result will be known in a collective bargaining agency among the Pure Oil Co.'s production and maintenance employees and watchmen at Newark. The election returns showed 75 votes for the CIO Oil Workers International Union, 79 for the Oil Refinery Employees Independent-union, three for neither union and three challenged.
