### MILLIONAIRE LIVES GUARDED LIFE SIX YEARS

ST. LOUIS, Dec. 15 — (AP) — Six years ago a St. Louis millionaire went into his hotel room, carefully closed the door behind him, and stayed there.

Since then he hasn't so much as gone into the corridor, and until a reporter for The St. Louis Globe-Democrat found him, in all that time he hadn't talked with a stranger.

Helmuth C. Setz, 53, son of a pioneer Missouri metallurgist, entered an exclusive hotel March 16, 1939. His brother, Carl Setz, said today that the prematurely gray chemist has kept to his single room ever since.

In the interview, Helmuth Setz said he had not become a recluse "from fear or dislike of people. Partially it's from desire to continue my chemical studies and read without intrusion."

"Would he ever leave his room? "Sometime I might," he said.

Setz's food always is served by the same waiter. Neither says anything during meals. His brother comes in once a week, and he keeps abreast of current events by reading newspapers. He has no radio, and never answers his telephone.
