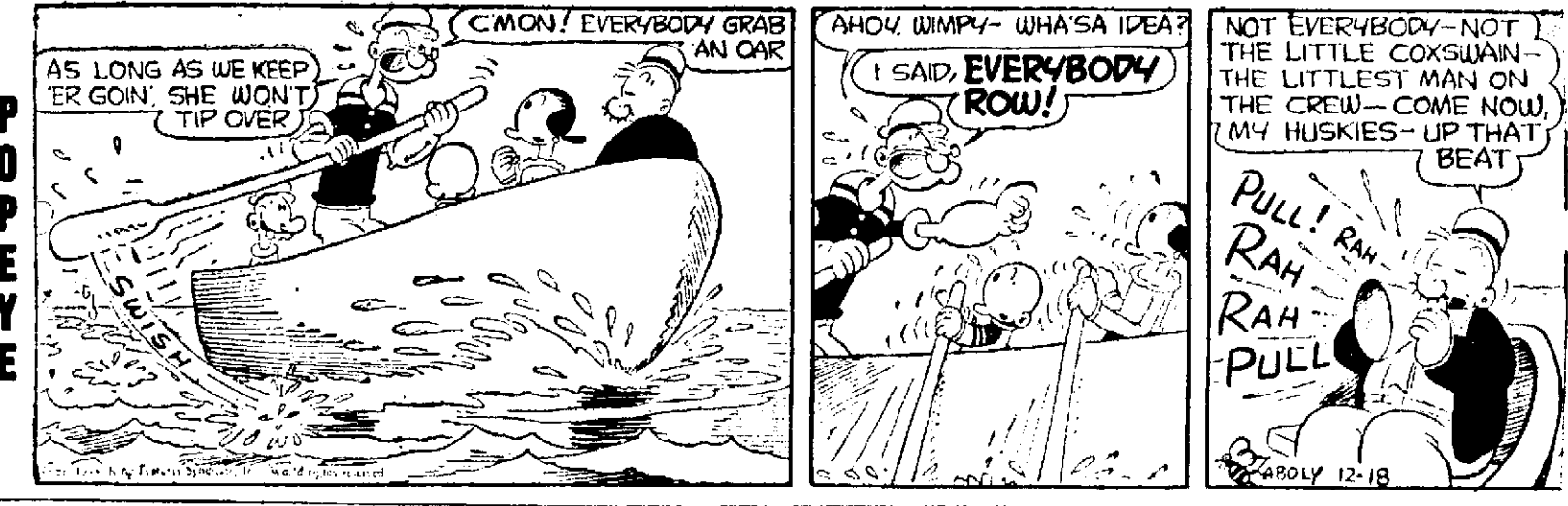
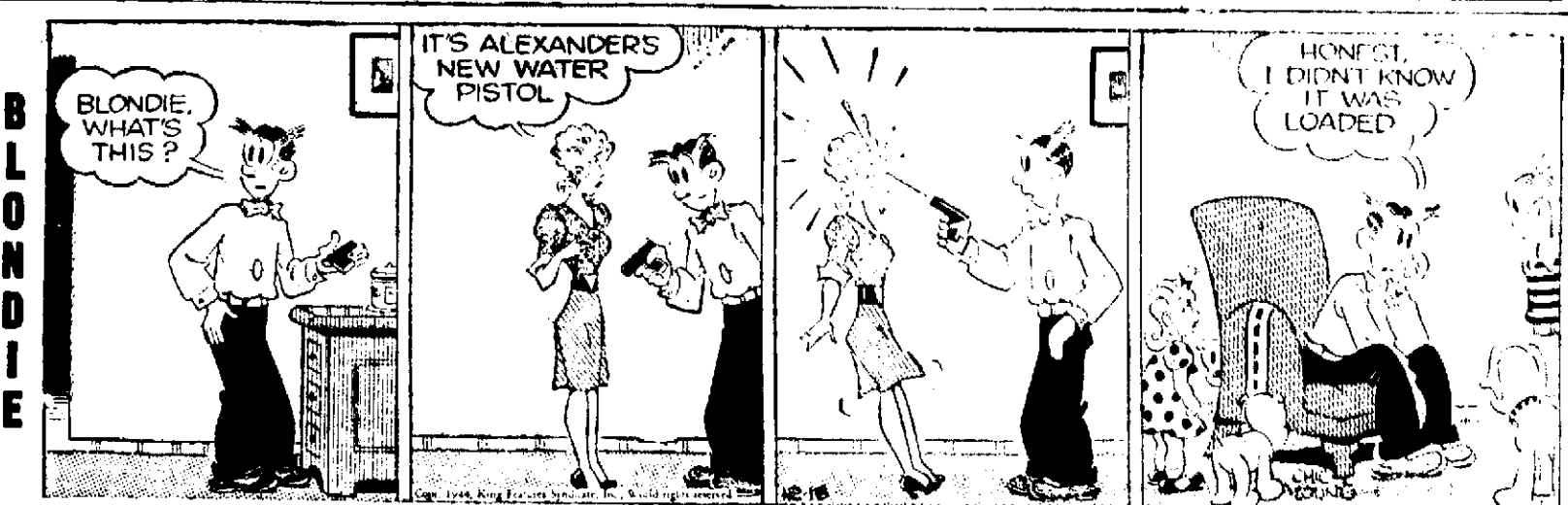
## THREE FLIERS DIE IN CRASH
