Bonus Strike Enters 2nd Day

MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — War production remained at a standstill Wednesday as 800 Globe Steel Tube Co. workers entered the second day of their strike in protest against a Christmas bonus reduction.
Leon Kortka, president of the AFL federal labor union No. 18499, the bargaining unit at the plant, said the strike was "unauthorized" and that the union executive board was in session today, trying to get the men back to work.
A company spokesman reported that the men walked out after lunch Tuesday when bulletin board notices announced the holiday bonus which amounted to a maximum of \$120 in 1943, was cut to \$72 maximum this year. The night shift reported to the plant but turned away when it heard of the stoppage. Day shift workers did not show up this morning.
Kortka said that management and union representatives met Tuesday but achieved no agreement. He denied a report that the union as a whole requested the bonus be increased to the 1943 figure.
The Globe plant makes steel tubing for shells, rockets, and planes and is said to be about 96 per cent engaged on war contracts.

Uncle Ray's Corner

BOHEMIAN KING BECAME HERO OF SONG WRITTEN BY ENGLISH CLERGYMAN

Among the many Christmas songs, there is one known as "Good King Wenceslaus." This song, or carol, is popular with later centuries.

Of the true history of Good King Wenceslaus, only a little is known. He ruled Bohemia for several years, and adopted the Christian faith. We are told that many of his people did not want to become Christians, and that he was at length murdered.

A legend has grown up that King Wenceslaus, on a winter's day, saw an old man who was ill clothed and shivered in the cold. Taking off his war cloak, the king handed it to the old man as a gift.

The song, "Good King Wenceslaus," was written by a British clergyman, John Mason Neale, about a century ago.

Another old Christmas song was made up in England about 400 years ago. It speaks of "Thrice welcome Christmas which brings in good cheer, minced pies and plum porridge, with pig, goose and capon."

Mince pies and plum pudding still hold their place at Christmas dinner in England, but during the past century the turkey has become the favorite fowl eaten on this festive day. Turkeys are birds of the New World, but they have found a place in the barnyards of many farmers in Europe. As a result of the war, the majority of people in Europe will not feast very much this year.

Even in time of peace, however, the turkey is far from being the common "Christmas dish" in Europe. In Norway and Sweden, the people usually feast on roast pork or goose, or both. Sometimes a roast pig, with a red apple in its mouth, is the chief object on the Christmas dinner table.

In Denmark the goose is served most commonly, and the same is true in Bulgaria. In France people like to feast on truffled turkey, goose livers, oysters, lobsters, snails and frog's legs.
