U. S. HOSPITAL FLEET CAN CARE FOR 22,000

NEW YORK, Dec. 22—(UP)—The American armed services now possess a fleet of 86 new hospital ships which offer facilities for approximately 22,000 patients. Converted luxury liners, Liberty ships, and former troop transports are included in the fleet.

The ships were made available to the Army and Navy by the Merchant Marine. In speaking of the Merchant Marine's part in building up the hospital fleet, Frank J. Taylor, president of the American Merchant Marine Institute, pointed out that in 1939 only one hospital ship was in service, and that it was fortunate that the vessels could be made available by the nation's shipping.

The average hospital ship has about 600 beds and is the equivalent of a seven to nine story hospital covering a small city block. Leading the fleet are three former world cruise liners, the President Madison, the President Buchanan, and the President Fillmore.

LOUISIANAN LAUDED FOR CATTLE EFFORTS

WELSH, Pa., Dec. 22—(UP)—A. R. McBurney, one of the most successful rice growers and livestock farmers in Jefferson Davis parish, is largely responsible for the development in cattle raising in that section, according to Fred J. Hurst, director of Information of the Farm Credit Administration. One of the outstanding contributions McBurney has made is the promotion of a weekly auction sale, conducted at Welsh, at which producers sell an average of 3,000 head of cattle a month.

Another outstanding contribution McBurney has made to the bulls every year. The value of this livestock industry is the distribution of about 100 purebred Angus service is apparent in the hundreds of herds of grade Angus cattle which may be seen in this area of Southwest Louisiana. McBurney asserts that small farmers are becoming conscious of the need of growing better cattle and some of them are buying good bulls.
