Young Borgstrom said today he expected to remain at the arsenal until March, then return to Tremonton, Utah, to help his father on the farm.

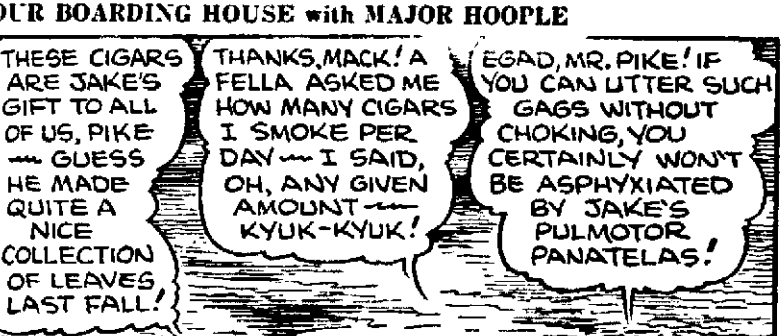

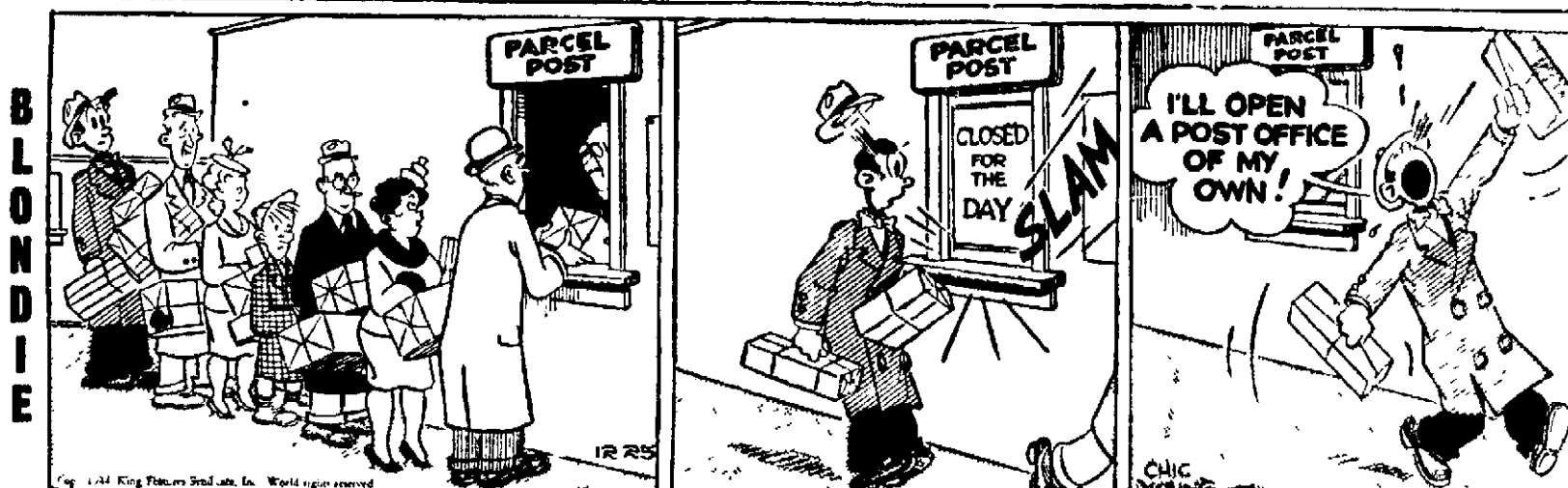

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26—(AP)—Francisco, Castillo, Najera, Mexican ambassador to the United States, said today that the old League of Nations with headquarters at Geneva, Switzerland, would have to be dissolved before its members could join the post-war security organization projected at Dumbarton Oaks.

The ambassador voiced that opinion to newsmen after conferring with Secretary of State Edward R. Stettinius, Jr. Najera returned last night from London where he attended a meeting of the supervisory commission of the Geneva League.

Najera explained that the United Nations and the neutrals cannot join that new world security league outlined at Dumbarton Oaks by the United States, Great Britain, Russia and China, in competition with the old league to which the member nations are bound by the Versailles treaty.

He declared that the two existing organizations cannot function side by side and that the old league must be liquidated before the United Nations and neutrals can enter a new organization.

SEVING BONUS RENEWED
