

Yesterday we spoke of the boundary line of Poland which was marked out after the Poles won a military victory against Rus-

vakia, Close to 3,000,000 Poles had crossed the Atlantic, to settle in the United States or Brazil. From 1921 to 1939, the population of Poland grew to about 35,000,000. There are no figures to show just how many persons live in the country today. The Poles have suffered greatly in Hitler's war, and the losses may offset, or more than offset, the natural increase in the past five years.

It seems likely that Poland's boundaries will be changed after the second World war. Perhaps the Curzon line will be accepted, but in that case Poland probably will be given part of East Prussia and other German land.
