## 82,634 YANKS LOSE LIVES IN '44 WARFARE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—(AP)—Official Army and Navy casualty figures, as of Dec. 14, disclose that 82,634 Americans lost their lives in combat during the year. Of these, 70,676 were in the Army and 11,958 in the Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard. An additional 318,157 were wounded—288,312 in the Army and 29,845 in the other services. Still another 94,261 were missing, in enemy hands or interned—including 88,063 in the Army and 6,208 in the sea services.

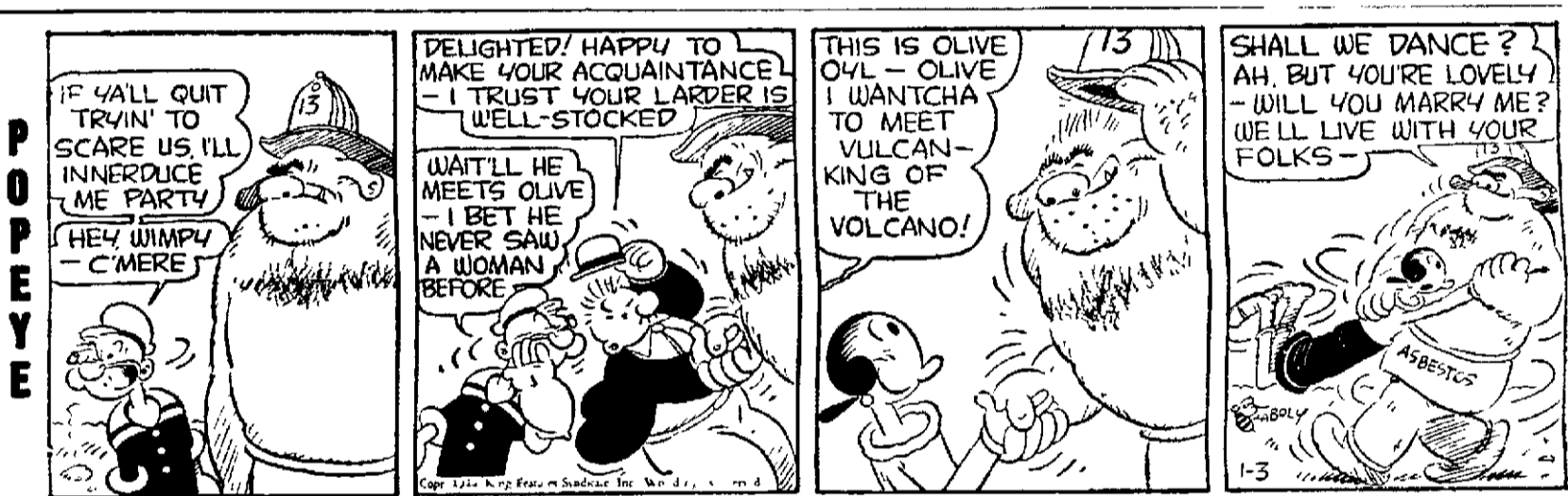
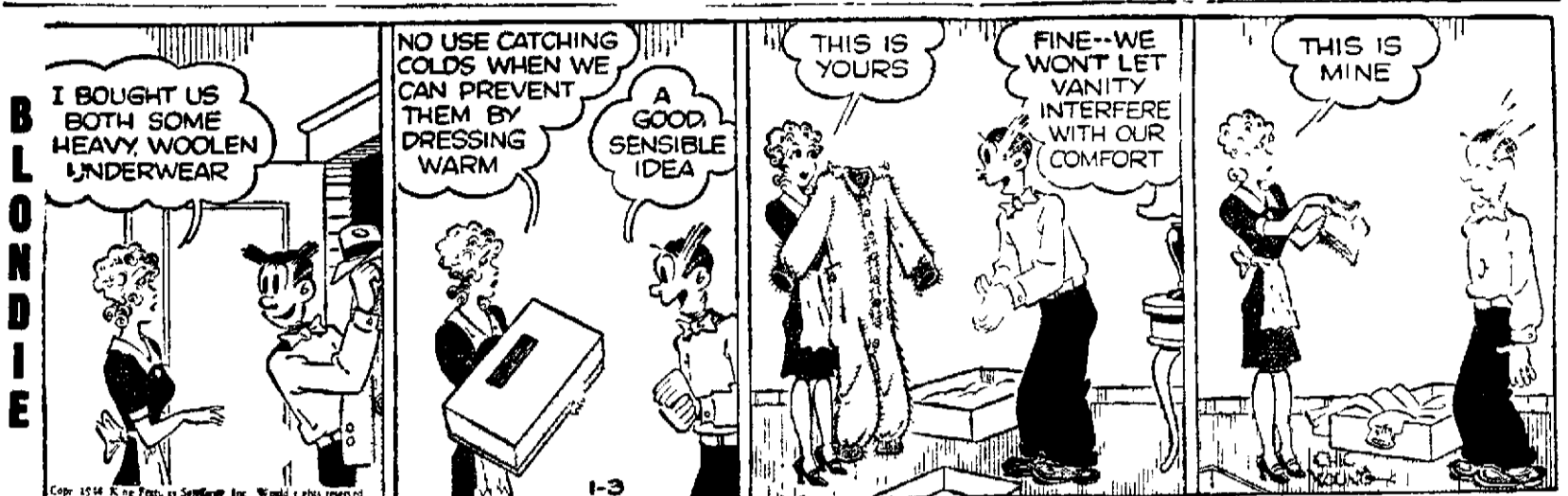
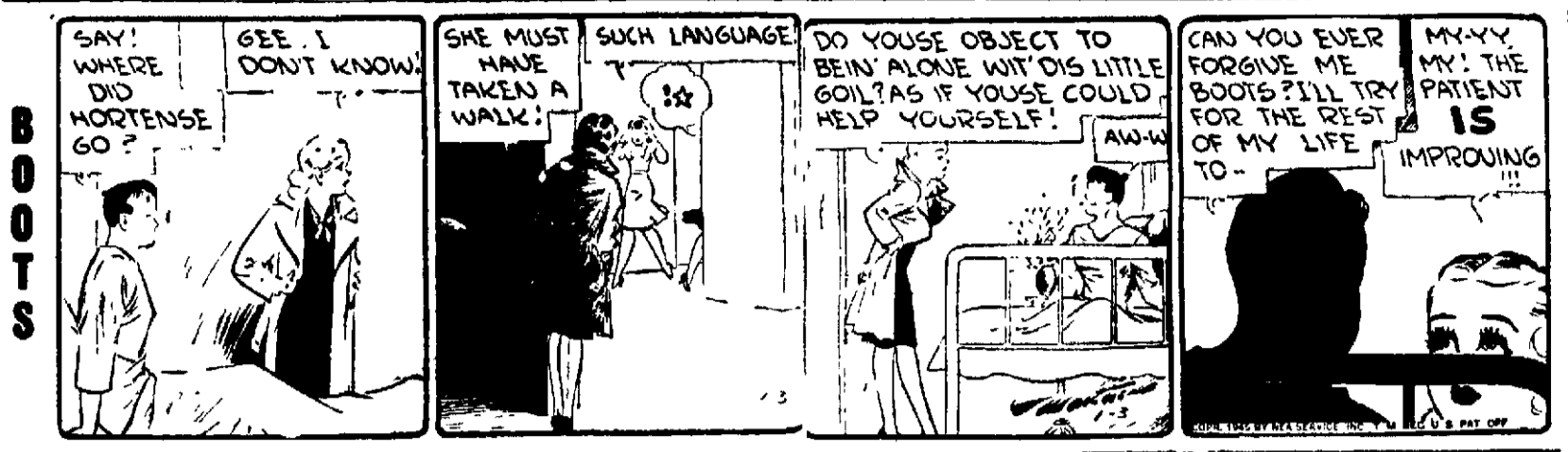
