U.S. Tells Study of Man-Made Japan 'Quakes' WASHINGTON (UPI)—A plan to "shake" Japan's key industrial centers into ruin with man-induced earthquakes was seriously considered—but never tried—by military and scientific authorities here in the dark days immediately after Pearl Harbor, it was learned Tuesday. The plan called for explosion of millions of pounds of dynamite to be dumped into the sea near the island empire at certain "trigger points" in the earth's crust. It never was adopted. But it was not wholly rejected. Rather, the idea was put aside while the more prosaic methods of warfare were employed. Top-ranking scientists advised that in theory the plan might be feasible. But, they pointed out, it would take tremendous amounts of explosives, many ships, many men, and involve risks since the operations would have to be carried out in waters very close to Japan. And with it all, the outcome was uncertain. It was for these reasons, back in those days when ships, men, and time were at a premium, that the plan was pigeon-holed.

Uncle Ray's Corner ANCIEN GAUL BECAME FRANCE FOLLOWING INVASION OF FRANKS. When we look at a map of Europe, the country of France may look small. It is, however, of fairly good size. There is about as much land in it as in five American states together — Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. It has more people than live in those five states. In early days the land now known as France was called Gaul, and it kept that name for hundreds of years. Germanic tribes later came in, and drove out the Romans who had conquered the Gauls. Among the tribesmen from the north and east were the Franks and the Burgundians. The Burgundians left their name in Burgundy, a section of eastern France. This section includes a part of the Rhone valley. The Franks spread across the greater part of Gaul, and from there across the name of "Franks." To this day the French use the "franc" as their main piece of money. Thirty years ago the franc was worth about 20 cents. At present it is worth only a small fraction of that amount. The people of France are called "the French," and that name also goes back to the Franks. It is well to note, however, that the French are not mainly of Frankish, or Germanic, stock. The Franks who conquered the land married with the native Gauls. The French of today have more blood of the Gauls than of the Franks in their veins. Millions of persons from foreign lands have visited France in modern times. Except in times of war, it has been a great center for tourists. The majority of tourists, however, have spent most of their time in Paris. Paris is the capital city, but it is far from being the whole of France. Only seven per cent of the French people live there. When travelers go to the smaller villages and farms, they gain a better idea of the French people.
