30-YEAR-OLD GOOSE THUMBS POT AGAIN

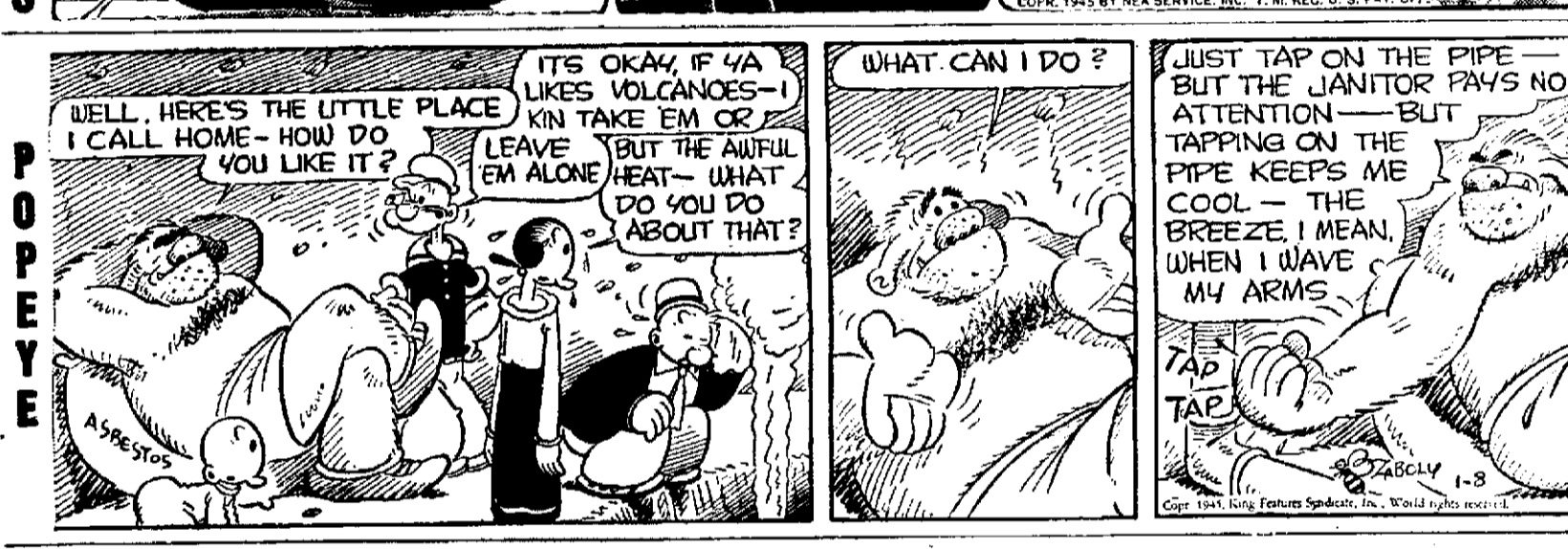
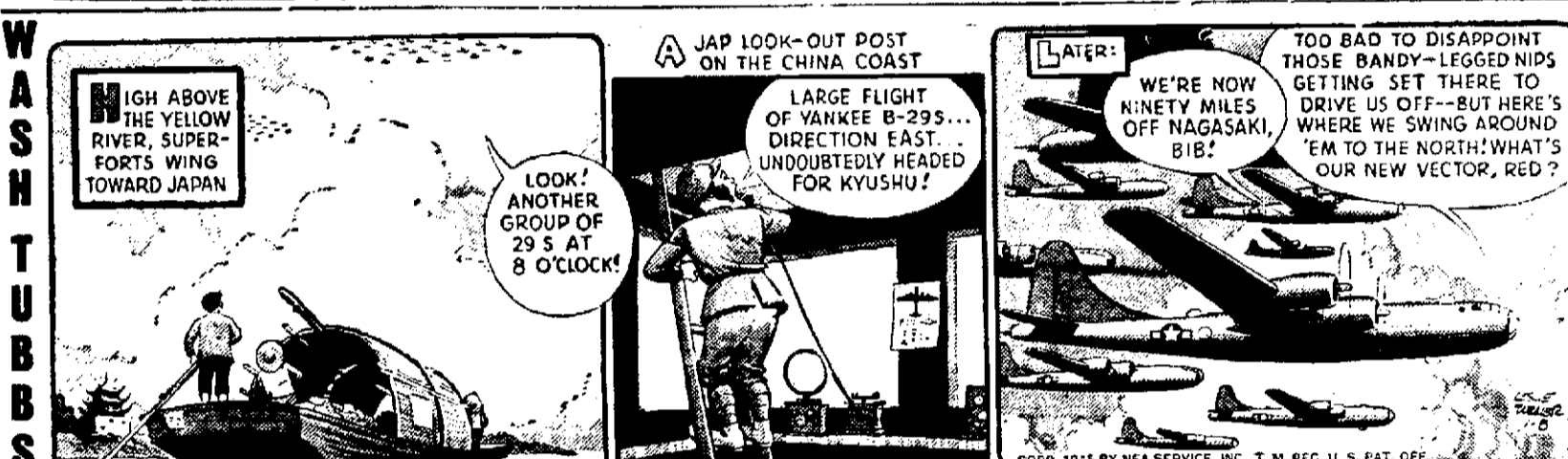
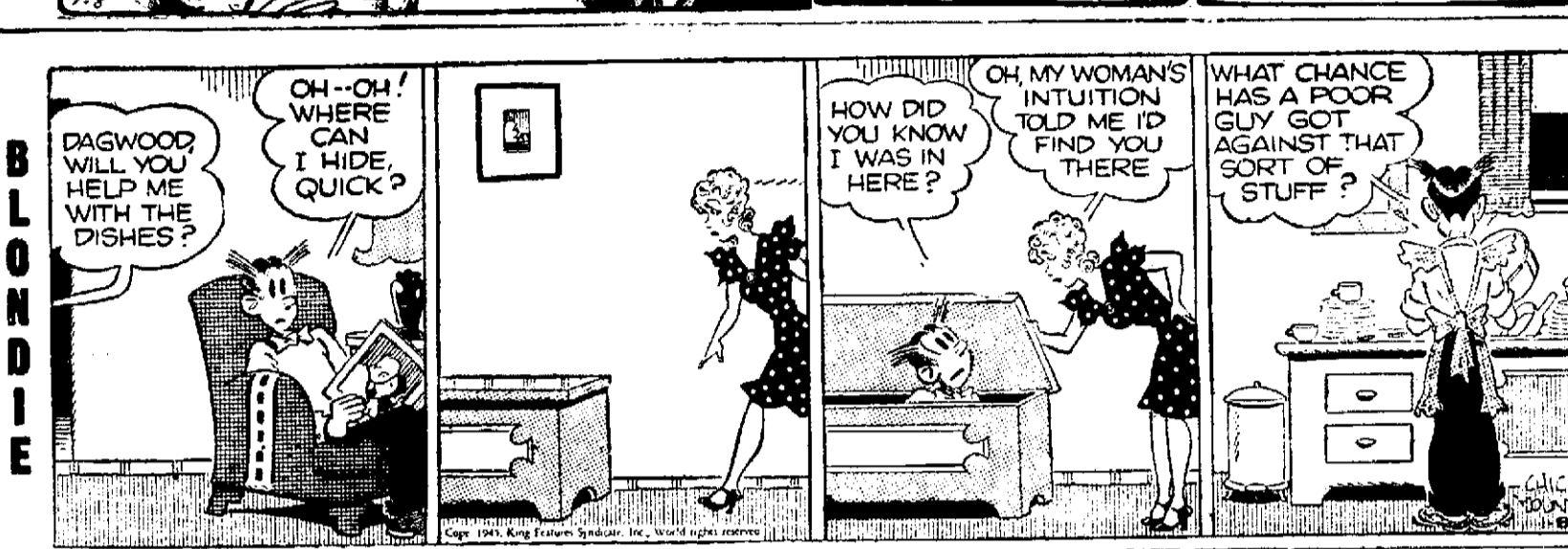

4 EXECUTIONS IN OREGON TO EQUAL RECORD

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 8 — (UP)—Four executions have been, or will be performed by the State of Oregon during a five-week period, a record equalled only once before in the state's history.

On Dec. 5, 22-year-old Robert E. Lee Folkes, a former Negro dining car waiter, is scheduled to die for the celebrated "Lower 13" murder in which Martha Virginia James, wife of a naval officer, was killed with a butcher knife in the lower berth on a West Coast limited train near Albany, Ore.

A double execution is set for Jan. 15, when Henry William Merton and Walter Lorne Wilson will enter the lethal gas chamber the same day. They stand convicted of a roadhouse holdup-murder.

But the largest mass legal slaying ever held in the state was on Dec. 12, 1912, or "Bloody Friday" as the old-timers here call it. Four men were hanged on that day following a prison break in which a guard was killed.

The state has conducted executions only since 1903, before which it was a part of the duties of the county sheriffs. Oregon's gas chamber has been used since 1939, when it was installed a few hours before an execution. Seven men, including Latham, have died in it.
