BABY DIES IN DAYTON BLAZE

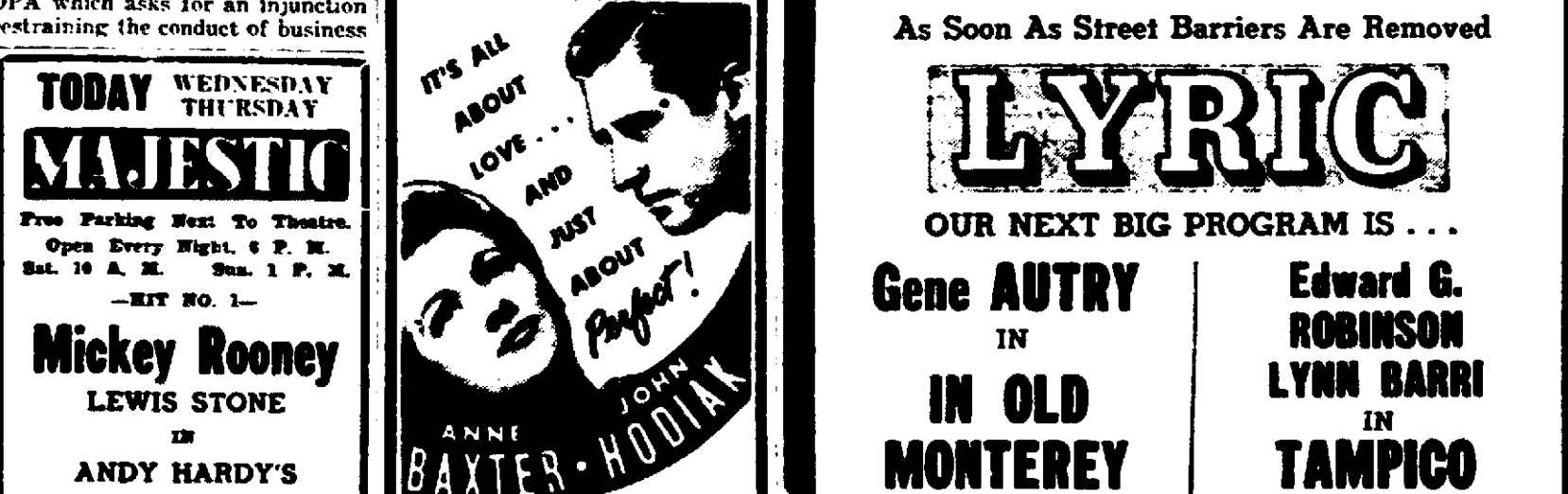
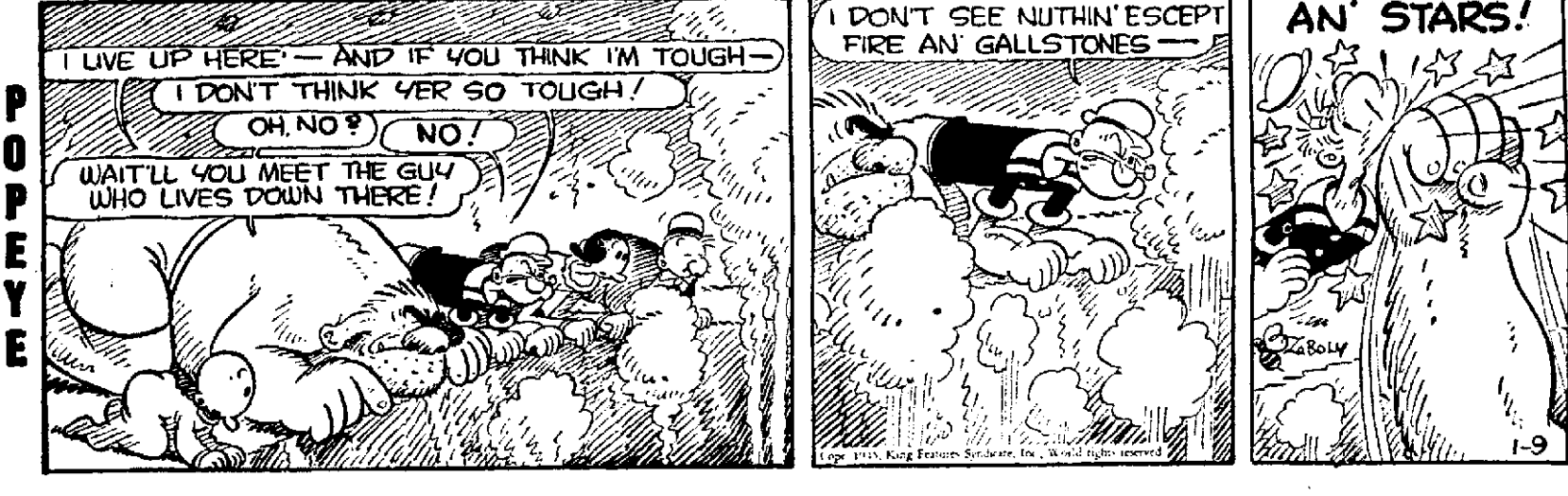
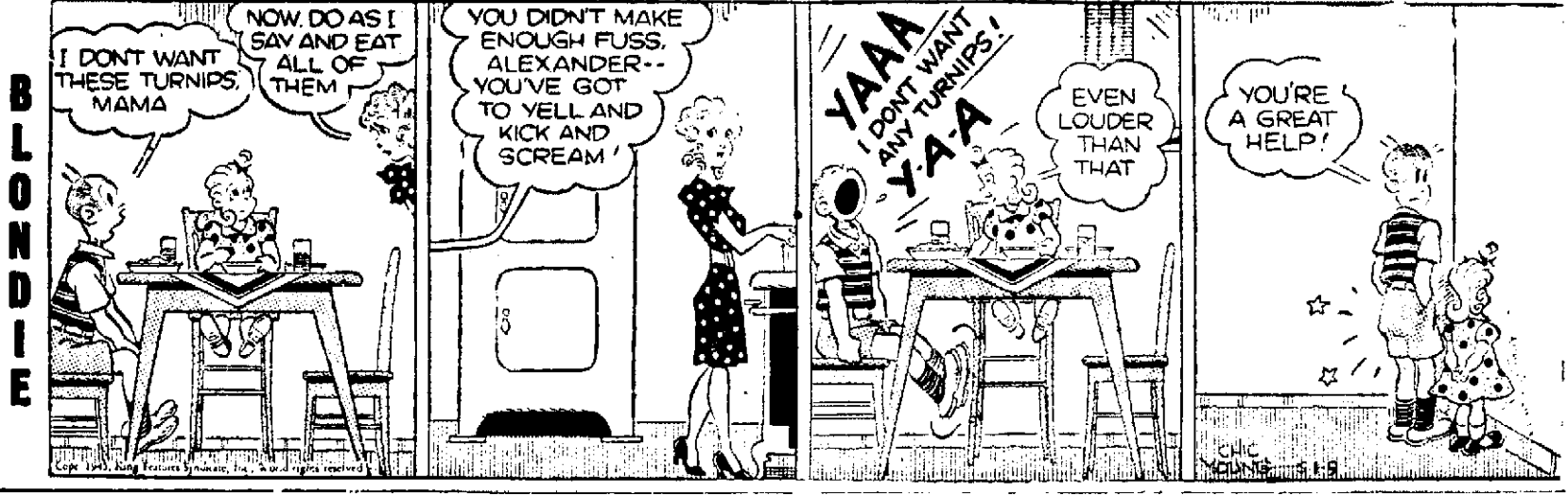
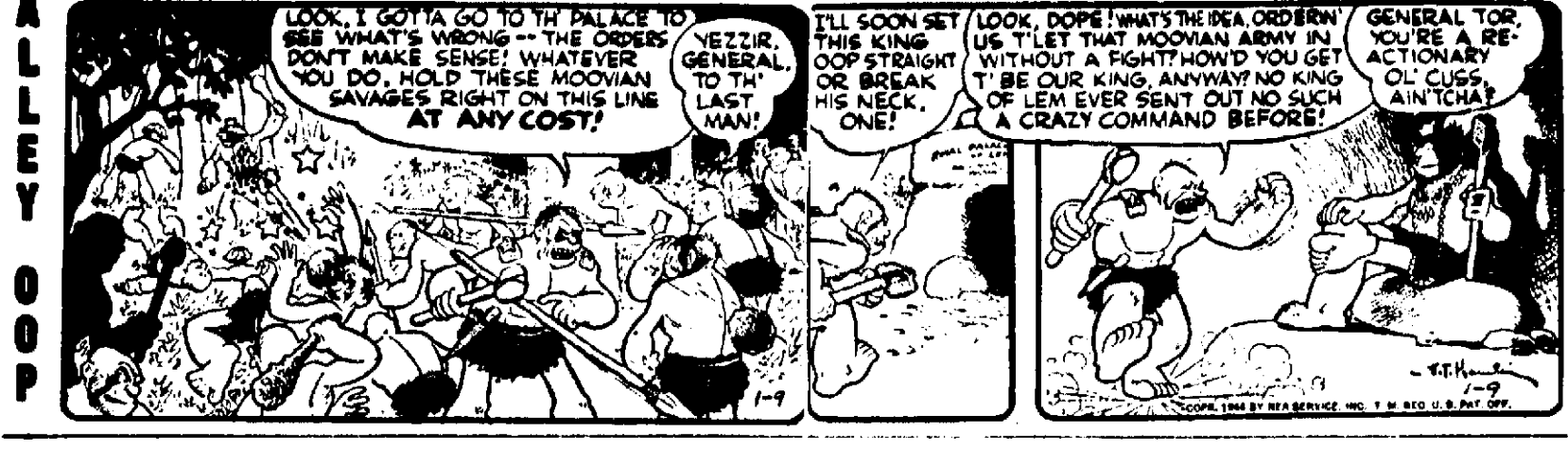
DAYTON, O., Jan. 9—(AP)—Six persons were burned, one fatally, by flames which swept a rooming house early today, while two women were injured as they jumped from upstairs windows.

Firemen were searching the ruins for possible other victims.

Rodney Bacucus, four months, died in St. Elizabeth hospital, where his mother, Mrs. Sanders Bacucus and three other children, Ruth Ann, 2, Sunny, 6, and Jimmy, 4, were admitted with serious burns. Owen Finlay, 45, also was burned seriously.

The injured women were Mrs. Anna Green, 25, a roomer, and Laura Brown, who was visiting friends in the building.

VAN WERT, Jan. 9—Van Wert, Co has recorded its 53rd and 54th casualty of the war, a soldier and a bomber-gunner. They are: Sgt. Walter Max Krugh, 22, a son of Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Kruch of Ridge-top and Lt. P. O. (Jack) Tester, son of Mr. and Mrs. P. O. Tester, Sr., of Van Wert. Both are Van Wert high school graduates.

Sgt. Krugh, gunner of a B-24 bomber, was killed Dec. 20, in the Mediterranean theatre. He had been serving with the 15th Air Force in Italy since October and recently had been awarded the Air Medal.

Lt. Tester was killed Nov. 30, in Germany while serving with the First Army. He went overseas last October and had been in service since Sept. 1, 1942.

Lt. Tester is survived by his widow, the former Betty Higgins of Huntington, Ind., his parents, and three sisters, Mrs. Edna Pomeroy and Mrs. LeRoy Davis of Van Wert and Mrs. Carl Bevington of York-top.

Sgt. Krugh is survived, besides his parents, by two sisters, Mrs. Robert Haines of Van Wert and Mrs. Lloyd Hammond of Miami, Fla.

Sgt. Harley R. Marshall, 23, husband of Mrs. Mary Marshall and son of Mr. and Mrs. Emery Marshall of Van Wert, has been listed as missing in action since Nov. 30, in Germany.

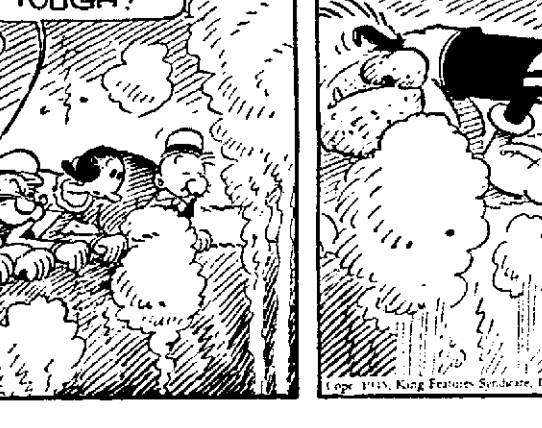

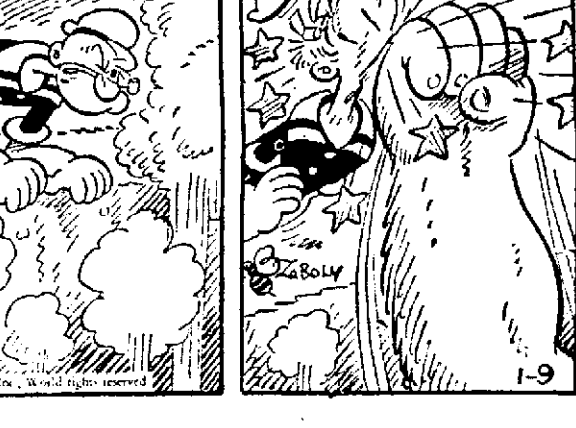
