WASHINGTON, Jan. 10—(INS)—The CIO Political Action Committee and its allied National Citizens Political Action Committee filed their final campaign reports today showing total expenditures in 1944 of \$1,327,775 as against contributions of \$858,823.

The report of the Political Action committees individual contributions account, the "working fund" for the general election, revealed expenditures of \$93,941 in excess of contributions—plus \$21,246 in unpaid bills.

PANCOAST TO BE ADJUTANT TEMPORARILY

COLUMBUS, O., Jan. 10—(AP)—Gov. Frank J. Lausche said today that Brig. Gen. Donald F. Pancoast would remain, at least temporarily, as adjutant general of Ohio.

Pancoast, a Republican who became head of the state's military forces under appointment by former Gov. John W. Bricker, automatically went out of office with Bricker when Lausche was inaugurated yesterday.

Lausche told newsmen that he had asked the general to remain—and the general had agreed—until Lausche could determine whether another officer he had in mind for the post would be available.

TWO WAR BOND DRIVES PLANNED IN NEXT YEAR

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10—(UP)—Prospects are that only two war bond drives will be conducted during the 1946 fiscal year beginning July, 1945.

With over-all anticipated expenditures cut, the treasury will need but \$35,000,000 of new funds from banks, corporations and the general public. This probably will be raised in bond drives to be held in the fall of 1945 and the late spring of 1946.

The recent bond drive alone brought in more than \$21,000,000.

REVISED TRADE PLAN OFFERED SOVIET UNION

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10—(AP)—Russia is considering an American proposal that Soviet acquisition of goods with long-range civilian as well as immediate war uses be financed thru a system of lend-lease credit.

The proposition has been in Moscow for several months and lacks either acceptance or rejection also some time ago there were indications that the Soviet Union regarded it favorably.

It is designed to bridge the gap between shipments of strictly military goods and those which have a partial or mainly civilian use.

The amount of goods which might be financed in this way runs into many millions of dollars also officials of the Foreign Economic Administration say it comes to only a small percentage of the amount of munitions going to Russia under lend-lease.
