13TH DEFICIT

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10-(UP) -President Roosevelt yesterday sent to congress his 13th consecutive deficit budget covering the fiscal year 1946 which begins next

This budget will report actual expenditures in the fiscal year 1944, which ended last June 30. It will report new estimates of expenditures in the 1945 fiscal year, which has just under six months

In budgeting one year ago for the 1945 fiscal year, Roosevelt estimated that total federal expenditures, excluding debt retirement and trust fund spending, would aggregate \$99,769,000,000 and that total treasury receipts would be \$43,425,000,000. He estimated then that the net deficit would be \$57,185,000,000 for the current fiscal year.

FUSE OUTPUT TO BE BOOSTED

CANTON, O., Jan. 10—(AP)— As part of a program to expand its production of shell and mortar fuses 65 per cent, the Hoover Co., largest producer of all-purpose fuses in the nation, will lease the former fort Pitt Bridge Works at Massillon. Cleveland Army Ordnance dis-

trict officials yesterday announced Hoover would lease the Massillon works from the Defense Plant Corp. and disclosed the company would be asked to expand its fuse output to meet the nation's increased shell production.

The new Hoover Co. unit will employ about 750 persons at peak production.






