COURT STUDIES REHEARING OF MURDER CASE

COLUMBUS, Jan. 11 — (UP) — The Ohio supreme court, which reversed a first degree murder conviction of Henry W. Hagert, 18, of Cleveland, today studied a petition for rehearing filed by Cuyahoga-co Prosecutor Frank T. Cullitan.

Hagert was convicted and sentenced to die for the murder of James and Charles Collins, 12-year-old twins, at Westlake, O., in August, 1943. Cullitan claimed that the supreme court was in error when it reversed the conviction because the trial court admitted in evidence results of a preliminary hearing during which Hagert was said to have been sane.

SIGNED RELEASE DOWNS 8 JAPS IS HELD VALID

COLUMBUS, Jan. 11 — (INS) — Holding that a release the injured man had signed was valid, the state supreme court today denied relief to Frank T. Golden of Lima, who sought damages from the New York Central railroad for injuries he received in a Lima yard collision Oct. 27, 1940.

Golden, an engineer for 17 years prior to the accident, won a \$3,250 verdict from the trial jury, but the court set the verdict aside and returned a judgment for the railroad. The validity of the release which Golden had signed was ruled a question of law and was not submitted to the jury. The Third District appellate court upheld the Allen-co common pleas court.
