PATRIOT SEES EARLY END OF JAP TYRANNY

(By The Associated Press) Col. Ruperto Kangleon, governor of Yank-liberated Leyte island in the Central Philippines and former patriot leader during the Nippon occupation there, was quoted by the Office of War Information as saying the American landings on Luzon "mark the beginning of the end of Japanese tyranny" in the archipelago.

The colonel added "Victory is in sight." Brig. Gen. Basilio Valdes, secretary of Philippine national defense and chief of staff of the Army, told the OWI at Leyte that "it is my belief and constant prayer that our troops soon will be in Manila." He said when Yank forces "faintly in Southern Luzon and entered in the north the Japanese were caught flat footed."

Liberated Filipinos on Leyte, said an OWI dispatch from the island, were "elated beyond description" over news of the Luzon landings.
