Uncle Ray's Corner

STAR BETELGEUSE COULD HOLD MANY OBJECTS LIKE SUN
People often speak of the planets as the "bright stars," but it is well to remember that planets and stars are different.

The planets travel around the sun. They have no light of their own, but reflect the sunshine to us.

Before we speak about the size of stars, let us make a note about the size of the sun. The sun has a diameter of 864,000 miles. This is 109 times the diameter of the earth!

Glancing at the sun, we might suppose that it had a diameter of only about two feet. It seems small because it is so far away.

Now we know that the stars are of great size. Astronomers have measured many of them, and have found that some are smaller than our sun, but that others are larger.

The true stars have been called "far-away suns." They give out heat and light, just as our sun does. All of them are thousands of millions of miles from the earth, and many are millions of trillions of miles distant.

A good winter star group is known as Orion, and it contains the bright star known as Betelgeuse. This star has reddish tinge, and we may describe its color as reddish yellow or yellow-red.

Betelgeuse is so large that it could hold hundreds of objects as large as our sun. If you could put the sun in the center of Betelgeuse, there would be room for the earth, to revolve about the sun and still be inside the star. Of course the earth would be burned up in a hurry if it got inside Betelgeuse, but that is another matter.
