

Four Senators To Argue: "What Are We Fighting For?"

Church Editors Support World Free Press Idea

What are we fighting for? A quartet of leading senators will give their answers to that question, when they appear on "America's Town Meeting" in its discussion, "What Should Be America's War and Peace Aims?" in the broadcast Thursday at 7:30 p. m., over Station WJZ.

Speakers will be Sen. Claude Pepper (D-Fla.), member of the Senate Foreign Relations committee; Sen. Charles W. Tobey (R-NH), member of the Senate Naval Affairs committee; Sen. Dennis Chavez (D-NM), member of the Senate Appropriations committee; and Sen. Allen J. Ellender (D-La.), member of the Senate Naval Affairs committee.

Because of the nature of the question, the speakers will not be divided along affirmative and negative lines. However, Sens. Pepper and Tobey have somewhat similar ideas on the subject, differing in many respects from the plans proposed by Sens. Chavez and Ellender. George V. Denny, Jr., is moderator of the forum.
