Confusion Seen Among Allies

CLEVELAND, Jan. 19—(INS)—Presented with "high-sounding phrases of idealism" one day and "by acts which belie the Allies' avowed high intentions" the next, the American people today "are in a state of confusion."

That was the charge made by Alf M. Landon, Republican candidate for president in 1936, in an address before the Cleveland Junior Chamber of Commerce last night.

"The American people are in the dark as to the real relationship existing among the Allies," Landon declared. "We have not been able to get a clear concept of real conditions. Every effort to inform the public of the enormous difficulties in our path has been hushed."

He warned that "a fatal dissension among the United Nations may be produced by heat generated by smouldering as easily as by friction."

The Kansan advised that it would be better to recognize the differences among the Americans, British and Russians and to compose them with "realistic frankness."

Landon pointed in particular to apparent lack of knowledge by American leaders of Russian military plans.

"The good news of today," he said, "should not eclipse the basic fact that we could ring Germany's neck in shorter time if we had the means for the exchange of definite military information that would enable each of the Big Three to fit its war plans into the others."

"Being partners, we have a right, then, to insist that Russia take her place on the joint military staff with Britain and America, in order to formulate a common military staff with Britain and America, in order to formulate a common military policy."

Landon said that the first job in winning the peace would be to put the United States in "the strongest possible financial condition" because failure to achieve lasting peace is more likely to result from the governments' economic instability than from inability to organize some form of collective world security.

TOLEDO MAN JAILED AS DRAFT EVADER

TOLEDO, O., Jan. 19—(INS)—A five-year prison sentence for refusing to be inducted into the armed forces was imposed on John R. Kellam, former assistant engineer for the Toledo and Lucas-co planning commissions. Federal judge Frank L. Kloeb also fined Kellam \$1,000 and costs.

Kellam contended that he should have been classified as a conscientious objector because he is a member of the Society of Friends (Quakers). He admitted, however, that he formerly had been a reserve officer.
