## WELLSVILLE SOLDIER SENTENCED IN THEFT

PARIS, Jan. 29—(AP)—Pfc. Edmond E. Swearingen, 28, of Wellsville, O., was one of ten additional enlisted men sentenced to prison terms ranging from 10 to 15 years yesterday by a U. S. general court martial trying railway battalion black market cases.
