CEILING PRICES ON LIVE CATTLE ARE EFFECTIVE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30—(AP)—Ceiling prices for live cattle went into effect today.

The Office of Price Administration said the effect will be "to give buyers and sellers—from cattle feeders to retailers—reasonable assurance of fair margin between legal buying prices and legal selling prices so they can do business profitably."

The order established an "over-riding ceiling" on live cattle and calves.

This ceiling—the top figure above which no cattle of any grade can be sold—is \$18 a hundredweight at Chicago until July 2, when the ceiling will be lowered to \$17.50. A similar 50-cent reduction also will go into effect at that time at all other market centers and zones.

TOBIN EXPLAINS POLITICAL PLAN

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 30—(UP)—Daniel J. Tobin, president of the International Teamsters Union, AFL, said today that he supported President Roosevelt last November, also he was convinced that the administration favored the CIO over the AFL, because he considered Roosevelt best fitted to lead the war effort.

Writing in the February issue of the International Teamster, union publication, Tobin said the teamsters "could have fared much better under a Republican board, (National Labor Relations Board), but then the employers would also get their pound of flesh and may be destroy the act.

"The employers, you will remember, paid for and ran the Republican campaign," he said.

GRANDSON OF LIMA WOMAN DIES IN ACTION

Pfc. William W. Wilkerson, 19, son of Dr. and Mrs. W. W. Wilkerson, Jr., of Nashville, Tenn., and nephew of Dr. and Mrs. W. V. Parent, 1914 W. Market-st., was killed in action Jan. 12 in Belgium, where he was serving with an infantry division, the War department informed his parents.

Overseas since October, Pvt. Wilkerson entered the service Aug. 8, 1943, enlisting in the Army Specialized Training Program at North Carolina State college. When the ASTP was abolished, he entered the infantry and received training at Ft. Benning, Ga., and Ft. Jackson, S. C., prior to going overseas.

In addition to his parents and aunt and uncle, a grandmother, Mrs. W. H. Parent, Lima, survives.

NAZIS PLANNING TO CALL TROOPS OUT OF ITALY

NEW YORK, Jan. 30—(INS)—The German army high command "is considering withdrawing certain contingents of German troops from Italy" to compensate for losses on the eastern front, the Nazi DNB Agency said today. The dispatch was reported by the FCC.

To replace them, DNB said, Field Marshal Albert Kesselring, supreme commander of the German forces in Italy, "has demanded the mobilization of Italian citizens from 18 to 60 who have not yet been drafted into any unit."

The DNB dispatch, also said that Benito Mussolini's puppet regime in Northern Italy meanwhile was contemplating the creation of an Italian equivalent to the Nazi Volkstrumf (people's army).

DENIS MURDER CHARGE
KENT, O., Jan. 30—(AP)—Ned Kellogg, 51, accused of first degree murder in the slaying of Miss Mae Wickline, 48, drug store clerk, pleaded innocent at his arraignment yesterday before Mayor Alf Lovell. Kellogg was ordered held in the Portage-co jail at Ravenna pending presentation of the case to the grand jury.
