CLERK BLAMED FOR ICKES' TAX EVASION ERROR

CHICAGO, Jan. 31—(AP)—A woman clerk in the board of tax appeals office, and not Secretary of Interior Harold L. Ickes wrote in the disputed rental figures on Ickes' affidavit filed for tax reduction on a loop building, says Gordon Nash, assistant Cook-county attorney.

In an investigation by the state's attorney's office of a charge by John S. Clark, Cook-co. (Chicago) assessor, that Ickes obtained an \$8,500 tax reduction for 1943 and 1944, Nash yesterday questioned two employees of the board. CIVILIANS WILL SUFFER CUT IN CANNED GOODS
WASHINGTON, Jan. 31—(UP) Civilians will get about eight per cent less canned fruits and vegetables during the production year beginning next July 1 due to increased requirements for the armed forces, the War Food Administration estimated today.

The total estimated production of 13 major canned fruits and fruit juices for the year is 58,000,000 cases. Of this military and other non-civilian requirements will take 61 per cent, WFA said. About 48 per cent of an estimated production of 93,400,000 cases of 15 major canned vegetables will go to other than civilians, WFA predicted.
