NEW YORK'S FIRST ELEVATED TRAINS USED STEAM POWER Most trains run on the surface of the ground, but there are some which move through tunnels and are known as subway trains. Others travel on tracks which are far above the levels of city streets, and these are called elevated

When we speak of elevated trains, we usually think of those which run by electric power. There are some, however, which are drawn by steam locomotives.

Steam-drawn elevated trains vated lines in New are, most often, parts of regular pulled down. tain large cities, they move on tracks raised above the street level. The idea is to cut down the danger from "grade crossings," which have cost the lives of thousands of persons, both inside and outside of cities.

Elevated trains seem to have been used first in New York City, the cars being pulled by steam locomotives. Electric power was not adopted there for many years, Stephen D. Field and Thomas Edison are among the men who worked to bring about trains pulled by electricity. In 1882 Edison and his assistants made tests with a small electric locomotive which pulled a single car over tracks at Menlo Park, N. J.

ing a period of three weeks an electric locomotive pulled 26,804 passengers around a track built for the exposition. Ten years later, the city of

Liverpool, England, opened what was called an "overhead electric railway." Berlin, Paris, Boston and Chi-cago are among the other cities

which were pioneers in adopting elevated railway systems. Today the elevated trains which are limited to city traffic almost always use electric "third rail" power for such trains. Elevated trains for city traffic
