WOMAN JURIST ASKS PROBE OF STATE HOSPITAL

CLEVELAND, Feb. 5—(AP)—Municipal Judge Lillian M. West-jury today asked for a grand jury investigation of conditions at Cleveland State hospital.

The judge's request was based on a probe by Edward J. Crowley, chief probation officer, after a former hospital attendant was dismissed on charges of assaulting a hospital patient.

"Inasmuch as the state hospital houses thousands of mentally-ill patients who are helpless and impotent to help themselves, it seems to me that the charges made are serious enough to warrant a grand jury," stated Judge West-jury in a letter to Dr. D. R. Sharpe, foreman of the Cuyahoga-co grand jury.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Feb. 5—(AP)—Frank H. Goebel, director of public service, claims to be a patient man, but...

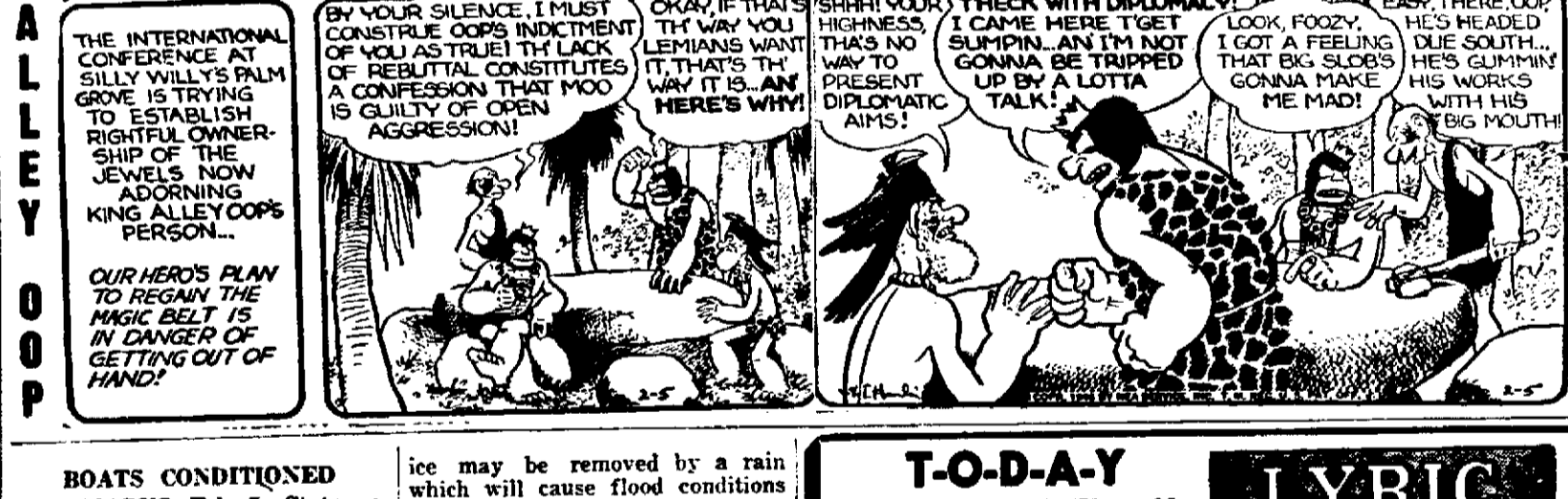
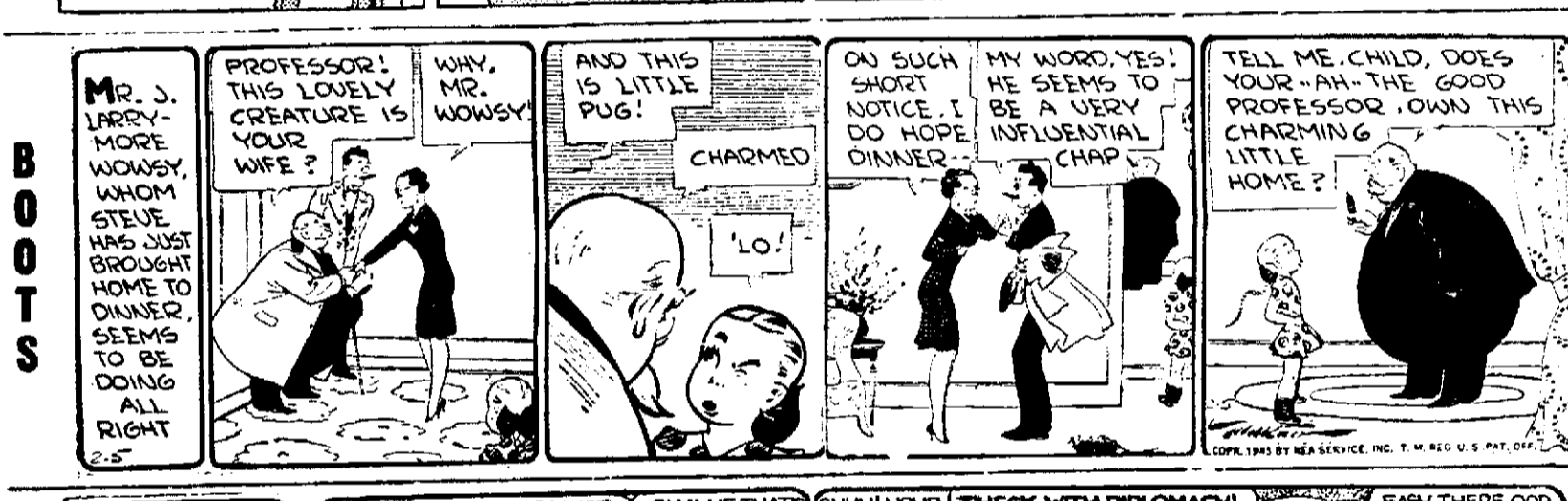
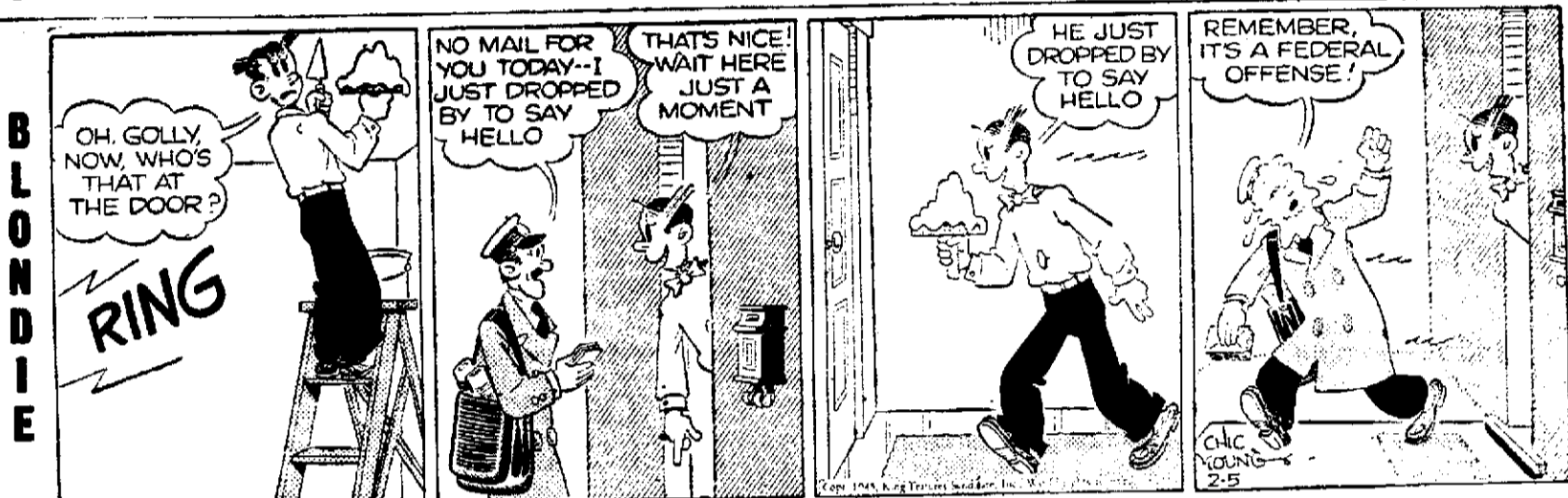
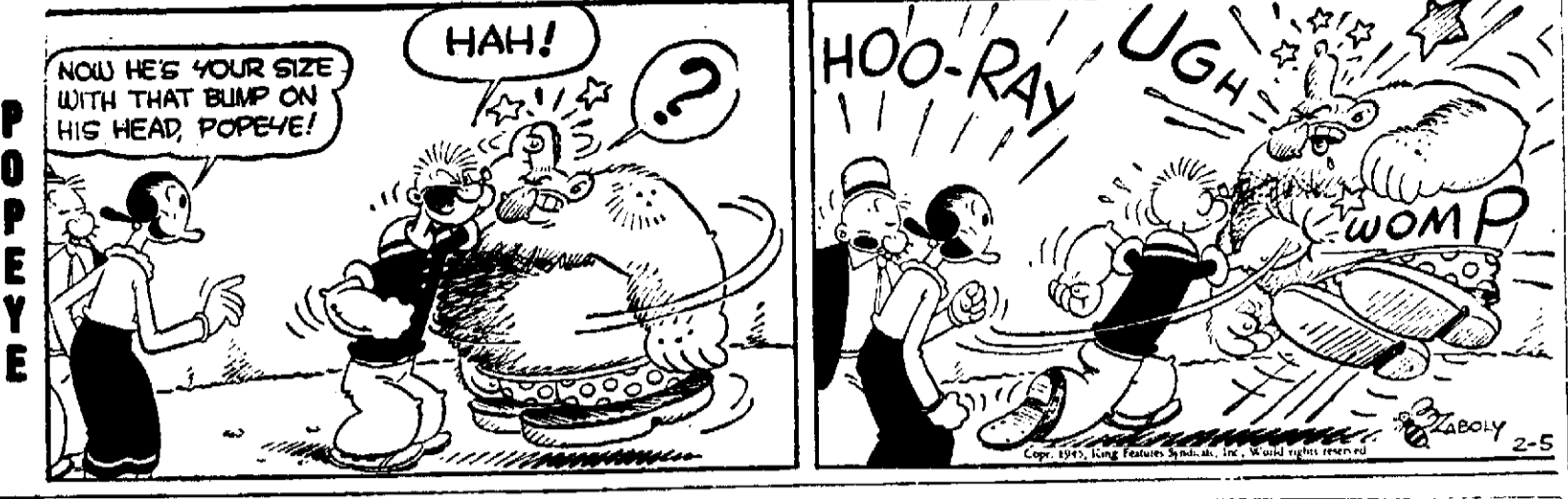
Agitated women have been calling his office, Goebel disclosed today, to complain they've been losing their teeth, or losing the enamel off them, or experiencing gum troubles.

POLES DESERT NAZI ARMY ON ITALIAN FRONT

ROME, Feb. 5—(AP)—A number of impressed Polish troops from Silesia have deserted to the American lines. They learned for the first time today that the Germans were being rapidly driven from the homeland by the Red army offensive.

The Poles—some of whose countrymen are fighting with the British Eighth Army on the Adriatic front—said they were subjected to contemptuous abuse by German non-coms and had been told only of "local attacks" on the eastern front.

The U. S. Fifth Army and Eighth Army patrols again made raids into the enemy line, inflicting casualties and taking prisoners, but there was no other ground activity.

The weather was so bad that the air forces were grounded except for a few medium bombers, which flew 450 sorties yesterday, most of them against the enemy lifeline thru the Brenner Pass.
