

Danger Of Fascism Here Subject Of Air Discussion

Whether or not there is danger of Fascism taking hold in this country is the timely discussion topic, when "America's Town Meeting" broadcasts another of its debates on current controversies, Thursday at 7:30 p. m., Lima time, over Station WJZ. "Is America in Danger of Going Fascist?" is the question.

Aged Slayer Convicted For Manslaughter

FAIRMONT, W. Va., Feb. 7—(UP)—A defense motion to set aside a verdict of guilty of voluntary manslaughter returned in the case of 74-year-old Benjamin Franklin Male yesterday will be argued next week before Marion-co

Circuit Court Judge Charles E. Miller.

The voluntary manslaughter verdict was returned yesterday afternoon by a jury which deliberated one hour and 50 minutes before filing back into the crowded courtroom. There Male quietly awaited the reading of his fate on the 40-year-old murder charge in connection with the death of Walter O. Smith, a crippled school teacher, Nov. 16, 1905.

If the defense motion is overruled, the verdict will stand and carries a penalty of one to five years in prison.

Male was charged with slaying Smith in 1905 following an argument over the beating of Male's son, Cecil, by the teacher.

Male returned to Fairmont from St. Helens, Ore., to stand trial on the murder charge after living for the past 38 years in the western state under the name of Andrew Jackson Pritchard. He returned voluntarily after his ailing wife informed Oregon authorities that her husband was wanted in West Virginia on a murder charge.

TWO MINERS KILLED IN GAS EXPLOSION

SALINA, Pa., Feb. 8—(INS)—Two men were killed today in a gas explosion in the Cochran Coal Co.'s pit mine near Salina, state police reported.

Police said 20 other miners walked out of the pit at the end of their shift without knowing the explosion had occurred in a mine section three miles from the pit entrance.

HAMBURGERS Pan-fried or broiled

1 1/4 lb. ground beef
1 cup bread crumbs
1/2 cup milk
1 1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. pepper
2 tbsps. chopped parsley
2 tbsps. chopped onion (optional)

Combine all ingredients thoroughly. Shape into 6 large or 9 medium sized patties. To pan-fry, brown patties quickly on both sides, cover tightly, and cook slowly for about 5 minutes. To broil, arrange on broiler rack 2 inches below source of heat. Broil patties from 7 to 10 minutes on each side. Serves 6.
