**Umlaut To Be Indicated In German Names**

The three American news services, Associated Press, United Press and International News Service, have adopted certain additions to one agreement they reached in April, 1944, for use of a uniform style for foreign place names.

One change is agreement to indicate the umlaut in German names by the customary device of placing the letter "E" after the vowel affected. Names immediately in the news which thus will be altered are Kuestrin instead of Kuestrin, Duesseldorf instead of Duesseldorf, Juelich instead of Juelich.

This change was made because it was recognized that omission of the umlaut leads to mispronunciation, that the umlaut is an essential part of the word.

The 1944 agreement, which attempted to end confusion of readers arising from differing spellings of names in the war news, provided for the adoption in general of the style of the National Geographic society with certain exceptions to conform to general American usage.

From the 40,000 names listed by the National Geographic society the three services then listed 78 exceptions, place names whose Anglicized forms had become a part of western culture. Notable examples were Rome instead of Roma, Athens instead of Athenia.

On the same basis the following list of further exceptions has been adopted:

Aral sea, Archangel, Balearic Islands, Bangkok, Easter Island, Fochow, Ithaca, Kingstown (Ireland), Moravská Ostrava (Czechoslovakia), Padua, Pescadore Islands, Sidon, Tiflis, Volcano Islands, Wenchow, Wrangel Island, Yellow river and Zuider eze.

Acting Chief M. F. Laughlin brought the attachment back with him from his recent visit to Great Lakes Naval Training station, Great Lakes, Ill.

Representing one of the latest instruments in fire fighting, the nozzle which can be adjusted to throw a fine fog spray or steady stream, has been adopted by the Navy for interior fire combat.

Laughlin said the nozzle, which was loaned for demonstration purposes by officials at Great Lakes, is invaluable to fight oil or gasoline blazes.
