Col. Radcliffe commands the 2nd Battalion of the 148th Inf. Regt. of the 31st Ohio Division.

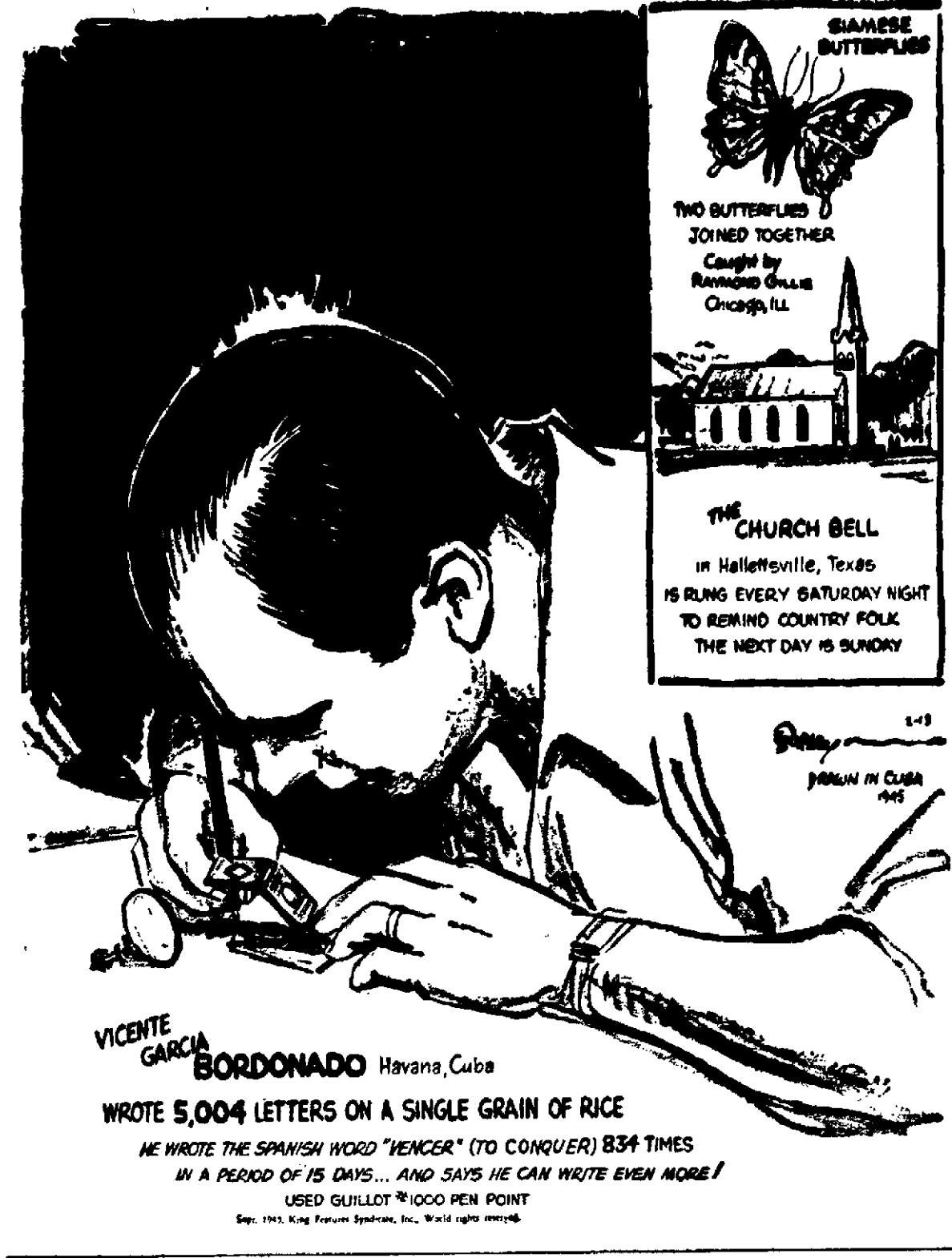

TWO HARDIN-CO MEN PRISONERS

In a letter from Sgt. Firestone to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Firestone, he did not say he was a prisoner, but the letter was inscribed in many German words. He said he was in good health and mentioned "I met Lloyd Runner the other day." The letter was written something near Christmas.

Sgt. Runner is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Wright Runner of Ada. It is the first word of either of the boys since they were reported missing.
