






There was no effort to fight

the French soldiers, or the Bel-gians who joined them. Strikes of German workmen folowed, but these did not change the French policy. In the summer of 1923, the value of the German mark fell to a point where one dollar was worth a million marks. In the autumn, marks had such lit-tle value that billions of them were

needed to buy a loaf of bread.

The French and the Belgians marched out of the Ruhr in 1925. Eight years later Adolf Hitler took power in Germany. He turned the entire Ruhr district into a factory to build up supplies for a war which, in due time, was to wreck Germany
