## Uncle Ray's Corner

### Munich Ranks Third in Population Among Germany's Cities

The names of many German cities have been getting into the headlines, and it may be well to go over the chief cities at this time.

Berlin, the capital, is the largest German city. Before the outbreak of the second world war, it was the largest city on the mainland of Europe. It ranked fourth in size among all the world's cities—only London, New York and Tokyo having more people.

The 10 German cities which ranked after Berlin in the last census are: Hamburg, Munich, Cologne, Leipzig, Essen, Dresden, Breslau, Frankfurt-on-Main, Düsseldorf and Dortmund. Each of these had a population of more than half a million.

Other German cities which have more than 250,000 people are Stuttgart, Nuremberg, Bremen, and Wuppertal. Of these, Wuppertal is least known outside Germany. It is a combined city, being made up of two old cities, Elberfeld and Barmen. The name was changed 25 years ago. It was founded at a good spot, you should find Wuppertal 25 miles northeast of Cologne.

Hamburg is the only German city except Berlin with more than a million people. It is about 250,000 short of having the same population as Philadelphia.

With more than three-quarters of a million people, Germany's third city, Munich, is nearly the same size as Canada's Montreal.

The name of Munich came from the German word for "monk." The land on which it grew up was owned at one time by a group of monks, and they had a monastery there. Eight centuries ago, the place was called "Villa Munichen."

Not quite 700 years ago, a nobleman known as Duke Louis took control of Munich. He ordered his men to build walls and a moat around it, and after they had finished doing so, he made it the capital of his dukedom.

In 1327 Munich was destroyed by fire, but it was built up again. In 1801 it had 48,865 people. This number had increased about 17 times when a census was taken six years ago.
