Uncle Ray's Corner

Yesterday I said that the average depth of the ocean is more than two miles. That is quite true, but there are parts of the ocean which are only a few hundred feet deep, and other parts have a depth of well over four miles.

We might expect that the farther we went from shore, the deeper the water would be. That, however, is not the case. There are places "in the middle of the ocean" which are far less deep than spots close to land.

For many hundreds of years, the best way anyone knew to test the depth of the sea was to let down a weight on the end of a line. That was good enough for shallow parts of the sea, but it was hard to net ropes or wires lines long enough to reach the bottom at deep places.

In the past 25 years, much of the testing, or "sounding," has been done with the help of echoes. A noise is made at the surface of the water, and an instrument is used to record the echo. The sound goes to the bottom of the sea, then comes back.

Sound travels through sea water at a rate of about 4,800 feet a second. That is almost five times as fast as sound travels through air. When the echo gets back to a vessel from a deep part of the ocean, the sound waves are known to have traveled for a certain number of seconds, and the distance to the bottom is figured from that fact.

The deepest part of the Atlantic ocean seems to be near Puerto Rico. That so-called "Puerto Rico Deep" has a depth of more than five miles.

The waters near Florida are less deep than most other parts of the Atlantic, but a few hundred miles east of Jacksonville and Miami is the edge of the "Nares Deep." The Nares Deep covers thousands of square miles, and in that whole area the bottom is more than three miles below the surface.

Above the Nares Deep, and stretching hundreds of miles to the east of it, is the Sargasso sea, which is covered with masses of seaweed. The seaweed is made up chiefly of gulfweed, which belongs to the brown alga family.
