State Refuses Liquor Shipment

COLUMBUS, O., March 3 —(INS)—The state will not accept the 6,723 cases of Victoria brandy which have been shipped to it by the Alaska-Pacific Sales Co., of Seattle, Wash. Governor Lausche reiterated today.

The brandy represents the final shipment of a 53,000-case order placed Dec. 15, 1943, and almost all of which remains unsold by state stores.

Lausche and his liquor director, Robert M. Sohngen, refused the shipment on the ground that the price had been increased \$7.20 a case from the \$35 a case price specified in the written agreement to pay for increased federal taxes.

Blue Points Upped For Canned Fruits

WASHINGTON, Mar. 3—(AP)—Canned mixed fruits, peaches, pineapples, pears and tomatoes will cost more blue points beginning Sunday.

The increase for the fruit is from 60 to 80 points for the No. 2 1/2 can. A No. 2 can of tomatoes will take 30 points, an increase of 10.

However, a No. 2 can of applesauce will require only 10 points, a decrease of 20.

Other blue point values remain unchanged for March.

Five more blue stamps—N2, P2, Q2, R2 and S2—have become valid. They will be good thru June 30. Each stamp is worth 10 points.
