WAR MAY HAVE MADE MOSCOW LARGEST CITY ON EUROPE'S MAINLAND

In wartime it is hard to tell the population of cities. Soldiers and sailors move in and out, and so do factory workers and other persons.

Yet it seems very probable that Moscow has passed Berlin in population. Before the second World War started, Moscow had a population of 4,137,000. That was only 201,000 less than Berlin had in 1939.

In the past six years, many things have happened to Moscow, and a greater number to Berlin. Both cities have served as important war centers. Moscow was threatened with capture by Germany in 1941, and early in the present year the Russians turned the tables by driving against Berlin.

has changed the populations of certain cities. Berlin has suffered greatly in this field, and has been called "the most bombed city in the world." When thousands of homes are wrecked, people move out of a city so far as they are able to do so.

Moscow has suffered little from bombing, hardly more than Paris. If it really has passed Berlin in population, it now ranks as the largest city on the continent of Europe. London is larger, to be sure, but it is on an island, not on Europe's mainland.

The history of Moscow goes back about eight centuries. The first nobleman to make it his home is believed to have been Prince George Dorigorki. A record says that this prince set up a villa there in 1156, on the hill where the Kremlin was built at a later time. The Kremlin is an old fortress with high, heavy walls.

Moscow was the capital of Russia until St. Petersburg was founded. After the monarchy fell near the close of the first World War, Moscow became the national capital once more.

During the time of the czars, czars, many cannon were placed in the Kremlin. One of these, known as the Tsar Poushka, was made about 350 years ago, out of 40 tons of bronze.
