Humphrey Bogart and the new screen star, Lauren Bacall, will appear together in the picture "To Have and Have Not," opening Sunday at the State theatre.

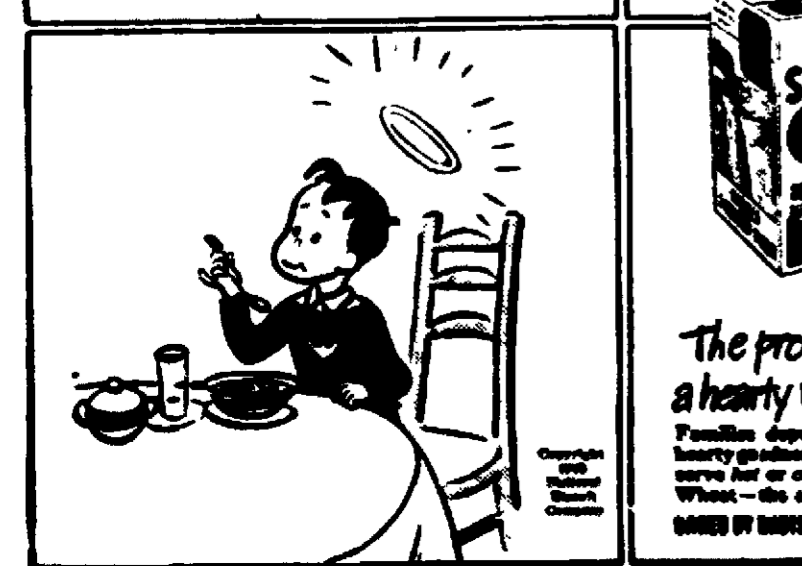
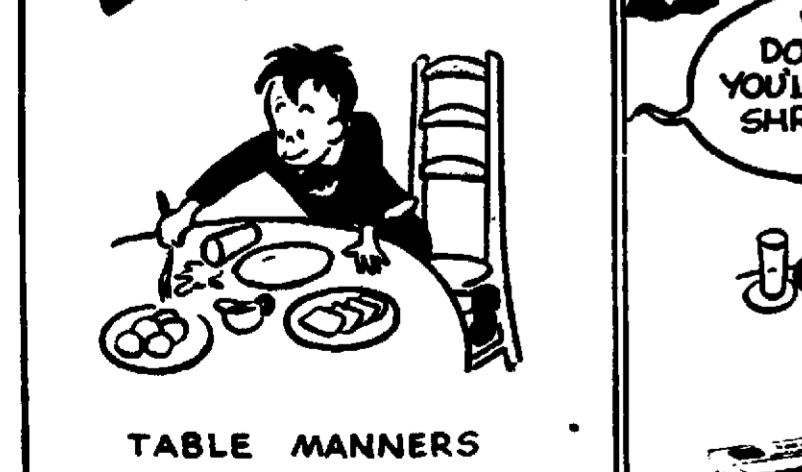
