

# Week-End Films In Lima Carry Mystery, Suspense

## Producers Skillfully Weave Work

Great steps have been taken in the production of movies but none so great as that of weaving certain effects into pictures to make them more mysterious. The films this Saturday carry with them a ton of mystery and suspense which can prove this point.

After reading some of the amazingly bizarre stories in their daily newspapers, people frequently will say, "It could only happen in the movies." Yet, the producers are making it happen in the movies. They can take place by real life, but they can't take place by real life on the screen. They'll be plenty of people who will doubt it. It's improbable, after they have seen the picture "Woman in the Window." Here's an excellent chance to test your wits in solving a mystery.

The choice of Peggy Ann Garner as "Francis" in "A Tree Grows in Brooklyn" is the most important child part of the year—moves, as much as anything else, that persistence will overcome all. Peggy's mother brought her to Hollywood a few years ago in hopes that the girl would stand out as a little girl with straight blonde hair and a plain but very expressive face. She held out for long enough and the role that her dad has is the fruit of her waiting.

Dick Powell steps from his frog and dance roles into a part of a grim private detective in "Murder My Sweet," currently showing at the Sigma theatre, a characterization which stamps him a dramatic actor of the very best. As an investigator who battles the underworld on a quest for a mysteriously long girl, Powell plays a subtle role in which he is compelled to take it as well as dish it out. Sharing the billing is "Nothing But Trouble."
