



 OPA to Stop Excess Charges for Repairs WASFIINGTON---(U.R)---The Of-fice of Price Administration (OPA) intends to put a stop to overcharges for repairs on house-hold appliances, automobiles, and form machiners. Beginning Mar. 19, regional OPA offices may require repair shops charging an hourly rate to do two things: Give customers detailed bills on the exact amount of time and materials used; and keep detailed time records themselves. Whenever an "unreasonable dis-crepancy" is found between the two, OPA said, "appropriate en-forcement measures will be taken.' Repair prices are frozen at the bighest March, 1942, levels.
