

Top Bandleader Hutton Leads "Ever Since Venus"

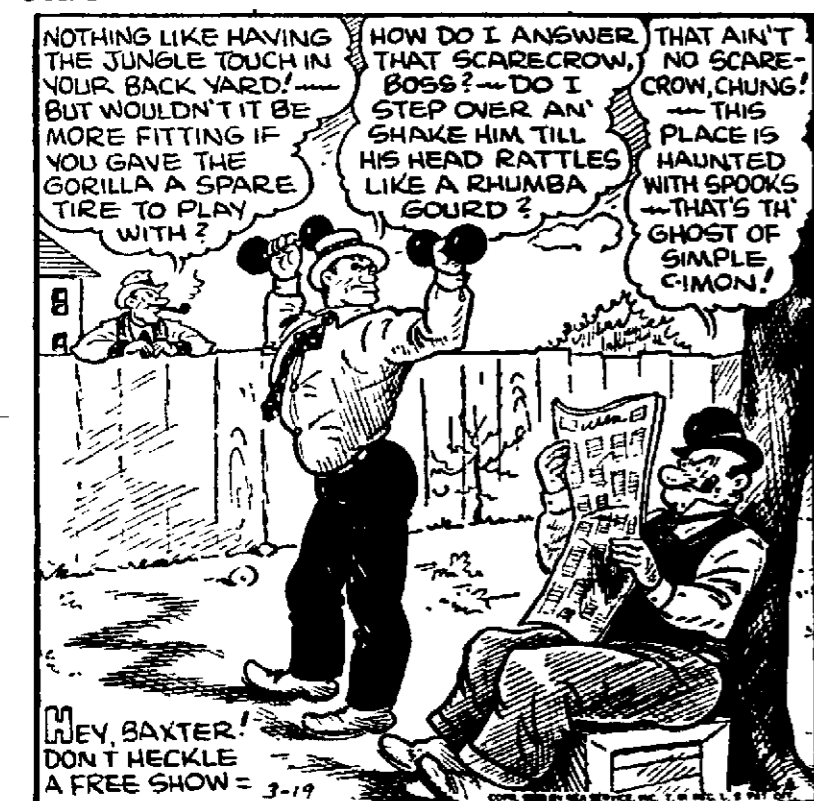

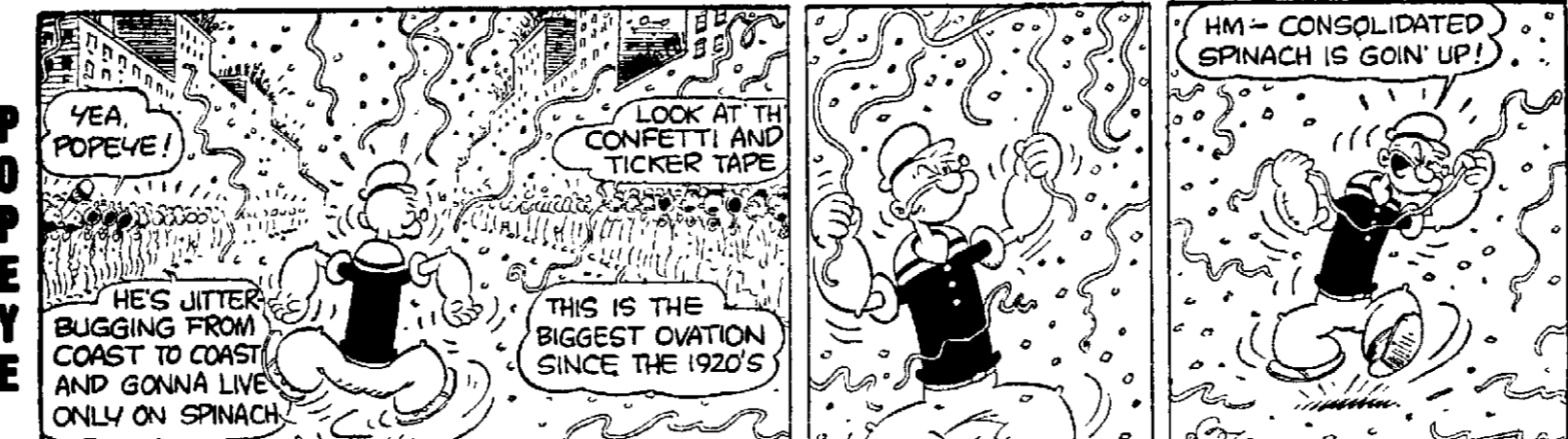
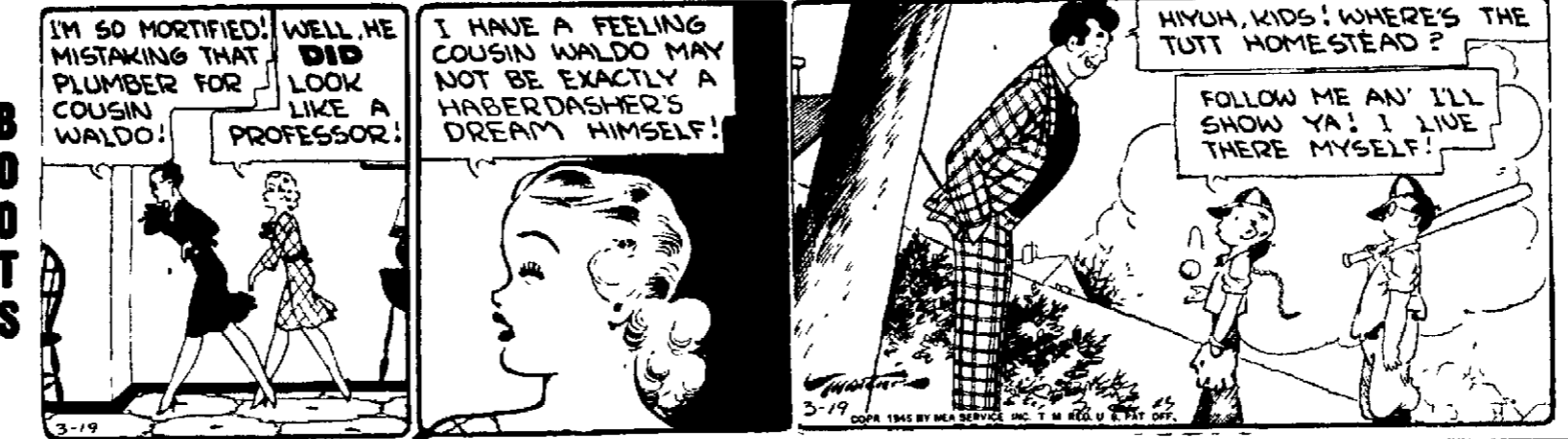
