Liberalize Curb **On Restaurants**

WASHINGTON, Mar. 20-(AP) -ln a further liberalization of the midnight curfew, the government ruled today that restaurants serving food to "essential" workers may remain open after midnight. Previously restaurants which were not customarily open all night could stay open after midnight only if they served food to war plant workers exclusively.

The change was announced by War Manpower Commissioner Paul V. McNutt.
