**ANCIENT TRAVELER TOLCABO ON VISITING "GORILLAS" ON TRIP**

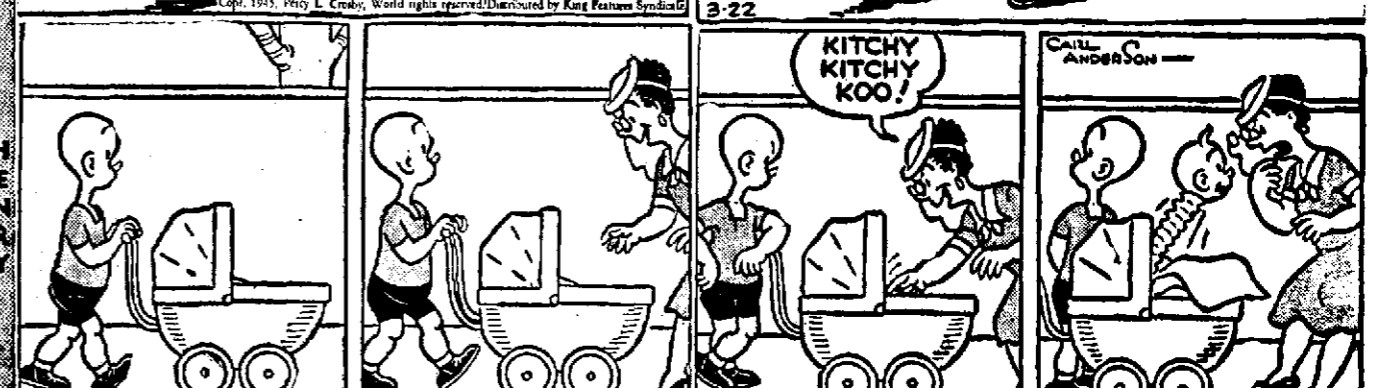
About 2,400 years ago a large number of boats left the city of Carthage in northern Africa. The boats carried hundreds of people who were planning to settle in another part of Africa. A man named Hanno was in charge of the fleet.

After being sailed and rowed to the west, the boats passed through the Strait of Gibraltar. Then the party headed southward, along the western coast of Africa. Stops were made along the way, and Hanno wrote an account of the adventure. What is believed to be his record of the voyage has been found, and it contains notes about "wild people" who were seen.

**First Full GI Loan in Madison Goes to Arthur Cass**

Madison's first straight 4 per cent GI loan was arranged last week between Arthur L. Cass, discharged veteran, and the Anchor Savings and Loan Assn. with the funds used by the soldier for the purchase of a house at 3305 Oak Ct. in the village of Monona, association officials said today.

Cass, whose wife is the former Elizabeth Yoose, Lancaster, recently was released from the army air corps after a year and a half service when he was attached to the Galveston, Tex., army airbase. The property was purchased from Mr. and Mrs. Robert C. Post.

The loan is the first in which the entire sum borrowed is guaranteed under the GI bill. Earlier loans have been made which are guaranteed 80 per cent by the Federal Housing Administration and 20 per cent by the GI bill.
