

# K-9 Corps Gets Full Credit In "Sergeant Mike" At Quilna

You simply cannot see the film "Sergeant Mike" opening Saturday at Quilna theatre without changing your opinion, without coming away with a feeling of admiration and respect for the four-footed soldiers who are doing so much to aid in the conquering of our enemies.

The strange story of a young woman with abnormal emotions and her almost destructive influence on the family with whom she is vacationing is the theme of "Guest in the House" new film now showing at the Ohio theatre. Out of the most suspenseful movies ever to reach the screen, "Guest in the House" is a searching study of a psychopathic personality. Its story focuses on the strangely twisted impulses of a seemingly innocent girl and reveals the functioning of a "split" personality.

For a high-class brand of screen comedy, the recommendation to see "Practically Yours" is not out of place; starting Saturday at the Sigma. Claudette Colbert and Fred MacMurray co-star with the production reins handled by Mitchell Leisen, famous for such "super" films as "Lady in the Dark" and "Frenchman's Creek." The striking thing about the picture is the shock which jolts movie audiences early in the picture. That is one thing that must be looked for in this film. Co-featured is "Kid Sister."

John Carradine plays the role of the ruthless killer who has the lust to butcher. Sharing the billing is "She Gets Her Man" starring Joan Davis and Leon Errol.

Russell Hayden is blazing a great trail to stardom of western pictures by means of the forces of nature. In the movie "Wyoming Hurricane" one easily can see what's meant by this statement. The picture is currently playing at the Lyric theatre.

**BRIDGEHEAD WOUNDED EVACUATED IN GLIDERS**

# Pre-Primary State Political Conventions Are Proposed

COLUMBUS, Mar. 23—(UP)—A bill to establish a pre-primary state convention was in the legislative hopper of the Ohio senate today.

Coupled with its companion bill, the Sheppard Massachusetts ballot bill, the convention proposal would enable more discriminatory voting in Ohio, according to Sen. Roscoe R. Walcutt, R., of Franklin, author of the measure.

The bill would provide for state, county and district pre-primary conventions. Delegates would be elected at the November elections in odd numbered years and would serve at conventions held early in the even numbered years.

Delegates to the first convention would be selected by the central committees of the two major political parties. The number of delegates to state conventions would range from 500 to 1,000 and from 100 to 500 for county and district conventions.

Conventions would endorse one candidate for each party nomination in the state, county and district. Party-endorsed candidates would have the words "convention candidate" after their names on the ballot.

# OHIO STATE REPORTS 14,332 ARE IN SERVICE

COLUMBUS, O., Mar. 23—(AP)—Ohio State university has counted 14,332 graduates and students to the armed forces in World War II, and of them 375 are dead, 89 missing in action and 83 prisoners of war.

Ohio State disclosed these figures yesterday, the 75th anniversary of the school. It was founded Mar. 22, 1870, when Gov. Rutherford B. Hayes signed the "charter act of college," creating the Ohio Agricultural and Mechanical college, forerunner of the university.

Today, the university is valued at \$22,000,000, covers 1,200 acres of campus and farms, and comprises 70 buildings.
