

MALE GORILLA GUARDS TREE IN WHICH HIS FAMILY RESTS

The hands of gorillas have been compared to those of people, but they differ in some ways. A goril-la's hand has far more hair on the back of it than the hand of a man. Also the gorilla's thumb is smaller in proporaion than that of a man. Partly because of the shorter thumb, the gorith's hand is not so well fitted for grasping objects.

Gorillas are able to walk in a somewhat upright position, but they seldom stand straight. They lean over as they move about, touching their hands to the ground for support.



A male gorilla, if it does stand straight up, has a height of from five to six feet. The females are shorter, usually being less than five feet tall.
