# Strike Looms In Anthracite Area

WASHINGTON, Mar. 28—(AP) —John L. Lewis today notified the government a labor dispute exists in the anthracite area, paving the way for a strike vote among 62,000 northeastern Pennsylvania hard coal miners.

Under the law the vote must be taken in 20 days, thus setting the poll for April 26.

This was the same procedure the United Mine Workers president used in advance of a negotiation with Luminous coal operators Feb. 26. The strike vote of 400,000 soft coal miners is due tomorrow under the Smith-Connelly wage labor disputes act. The bituminous contract expires Saturday night.
