## FLYING CADET KEEPS HIS DATE ELSEWHERE

DALLAS, Tex., Mar. 31—(UP)—After more than a year, Postmaster J. Howard Payne has an explanation why an invitation he issued a young flying cadet was not accepted. In January, 1943, Payne wrote a young cadet with the same name as that of Payne's son—Walter E. Payne—to visit him from Perrin Field, some 50 miles away, when and if he ever got to Dallas. He never received a reply. Then last month he received a letter from his own son, now a prisoner of war in Germany after being shot down over France, that explained everything. It said: "The Walter E. Payne you invited to our home is here with me and has explained why he could not accept your invitation."
