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Portugal Ready To Battle Japanese

LONDON, Apr. 3—(UP)—Portugal is preparing to declare war on Japan, and take an active part in the Pacific campaign, according to reports reaching diplomatic quarters here.

Portugal is reported to be assembling troops and material in Mozambique to use in an offensive to regain Portuguese Timor which was occupied by the Japanese early in the war.

Informed sources believe that Premier Salazar hopes to align Portugal with the United Nations and at the same time strengthen his position on the home front.
