# Post-War Trade Policy Topic Of "Town Meeting" Broadcast

"Are Britain and America Headed for a Trade War After Victory?" That question will be discussed by a quartet of experts on international trade, when "America's Town Meeting" broadcasts from Atlanta, Ga., Thursday at 7:30 p. m. over Station WJZ.

This broadcast will be the first in the program's spring tour, which will take it to New Orleans, Birmingham, San Francisco and Kansas City. Sen. Owen Brewster (R-Me), and Tom Linder, agriculture commissioner for the state of Georgia and president of the National Farm Committee, speak for the affirmative in the discussion.

Dr. J. Raymond Walsh, research director of the CIO Political Action Committee, will be one of the two speakers for the negative.
