Japanese Pay Heavily In War

WASHINGTON, Apr. 6—(UP)—Japan has paid heavily since Pearl Harbor for undertaking war against the United States. A summary of her losses, based on official estimates and reports, shows:

Fighting men killed — 739,799. This does not include Japanese killed in China and Burma. Moreover, 240,000 Japanese soldiers have been by-passed in various Pacific islands.

Ships sunk—2,928, including 323 warships and 2,403 non-combat craft. In addition, 73 warships probably have been sunk and 488 damaged. In the non-combat category, 281 are listed as probably sunk and 203 as damaged. Islands including those by-passed and neutralized—Solomons, New Britain, New Guinea, Marshalls, Gilberts, Admiralties, Philippines, Palau, Truk, Marianas, Iwo Jima and now Okinawa.

Japan also has lost heavily in military leadership. Her losses in this category have been greatest in admirals. The Japanese radio since May 1944, has admitted the death of 108 admirals. Some eight others have been reported killed, making a total of 116.

Few Canadians To See Pacific

OTTAWA, Ont., Apr. 6—(AP)—Prime Minister W. L. Mackenzie King, whose government was nearly overthrown last November when it adopted partial conscription for the war against Germany, embarked today on a campaign for re-election with announcement that Canada would send only volunteers to fight in the war against Japan.

Canada's fighting forces in the Pacific war will be numerically "very much less" than those employed in Europe, King told parliament late yesterday. He said the dominion's efforts after the defeat of Germany would "to a considerable extent" be turned to producing foodstuffs and war materials and to reconstruction, relief and rehabilitation.

Of the volunteer forces which Canada sends against Japan, the Army will serve with the United States and the Navy and Air Forces with Britain, the prime minister announced.
