4,100 Deserters Hide In Canada

Record Expected In Grain Movement

BUFFALO, N. Y., Apr. 7—(AP)—It is predicted that the 1945 grain movement on the Great Lakes will exceed last year's record. A spokesman for the lower lakes grain committee which met yesterday declared Great Lakes ships, Canadian included, probably would move 40,000,000 bushels more than last year's 583,888,803. The meeting at which winter grain boats stationed at Buffalo and Erie, Pa., are unloaded, but that Toledo still holds a few ships that have not been towed in for unloading.

Activities Of Black Market Gang Told On FBI Story

A thrilling expose of how gangland mobsters have been making off with "Black Market Billions" because of wartime difficulties forms the behind-the-scenes dramatization of "The FBI in Peace and War" series at 7:30 p. m. Saturday over Station WABC. The story, based on Frederick L. Collins' popular book, "The FBI in Peace and War," shows how the G-men finally rounded up a gang of racketeers who were making capital out of the gullibility of Americans. RED OR GREEN?

Judge Shows Mexican How To Mail Letter

TOLEDO, Apr. 7—(INS)—Mailing a letter had complications for Eduardo Perez, who came to Toledo recently from Mexico to work as a section hand for the Pennsylvania railroad. The "letterbox" which some youths pointed out to him was painted red and had a handle to be pulled down for mailing the letter. When fire engines arrived and the firemen asked to see the fire, all Perez could do was point to the letter he wanted to mail. After Perez explained through an interpreter to Judge J. Parker Edwards, the judge fined him \$75, suspended the fine and helped him mail his letter—this time in a regular green mail box.

NICKEL PLATE ISSUES BONDS

Takes Further Step In Reducing Mortgage Debt

CLEVELAND, Apr. 7—(INS)—The Nickel Plate road advanced another step today in its program of simplifying and reducing its mortgage debt structure by authorization of a new issue of \$68 million of 35-year bonds. Directors of the road late yesterday authorized the issue, to be sold at competitive bidding April 26. Supplemented by funds from the Nickel Plate's treasury, proceeds of

the sale will be used to pay off \$59,875,000 of outstanding 4-1/2 per cent refunding mortgage bonds due Sept. 1, 1978, according to President John W. Davin. Non-equipment debt of the road will stand at \$100,000,000 upon completion of the new refinancing, which is the last step in the refunding program announced seven months ago. The debt totaled \$151,662,000 at the end of 1936.
