Uncle Ray's Corner Englishmen Found Uganda "King" Who Lived Chiefly on Milk

Many facts are known today about central Africa, but a century ago few persons had much idea of what it was like. Only by the slow, hard work of explorers did the western world learn about the land and people of that area, Two Englishmen, John Speke and James Grant, led an exploring party into Africa. In 1862 they spent months in the country called Uganda, which lies to the north and west of Lake Victoria.

Both Speke and Grant made records of their journey. They described one native chief of "King Rumanika," and Grant wrote these words about him. hese words about him: 'He stood six feet two inches,

and had a mild expression. His five wives were of enormous size,



unable to enter the door of an ordinary hut. Their diet consisted of boiled plantains and milk. The king lived on milk, the juice of boiled beef and a very little plan-

tain wine.' Grant fell ill, suffering trouble n one of his knees, and had to be carried on a stretcher much of the time. The natives were kind to him, giving him fowl, buttermilk and sugar cane. They also offer-ed him fried grasshoppers and white ants, but he told them, "No, thank you."

The people of Uganda are mostly negroes. Other travelers have visited them since the days of Speke and Grant, and have been interested in their strange cus-One custom was followed by the chiefs, or "kings," of the Bunyoro

tribe in Uganda until late times. The ruler of the tribe lived almost entirely on milk, although he ate little meat. A herd of sacred cows was kept and from these came the milk for
