## Tojo Exhorts Japs To Resist

LONDON, Apr. 11—(INS)—Japan's newly-named foreign minister Shigenori Tojo, told the Nipponese homeland in his first official statement today that the fate of all East Asia hangs on the outcome of the war in the Pacific.

His statement, broadcast over the Tokyo radio, coincided with Okinawa battlefield dispatches to the Domei Agency asserting that the fate of Nippon rests upon the outcome of the fighting on that island.

Tojo asserted that the desire to win the war for the good of all Asia accounts for "the valiant all-out fighting of the entire Japanese nation as a special attack corps."

### ESCAPEE IS SENTENCED

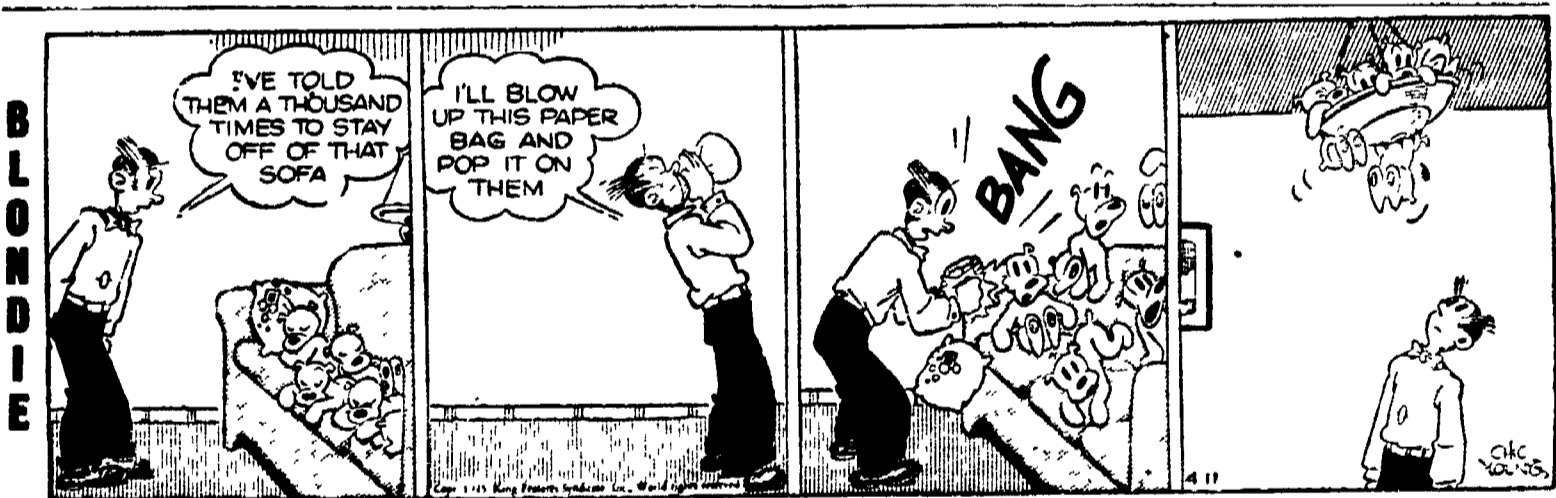
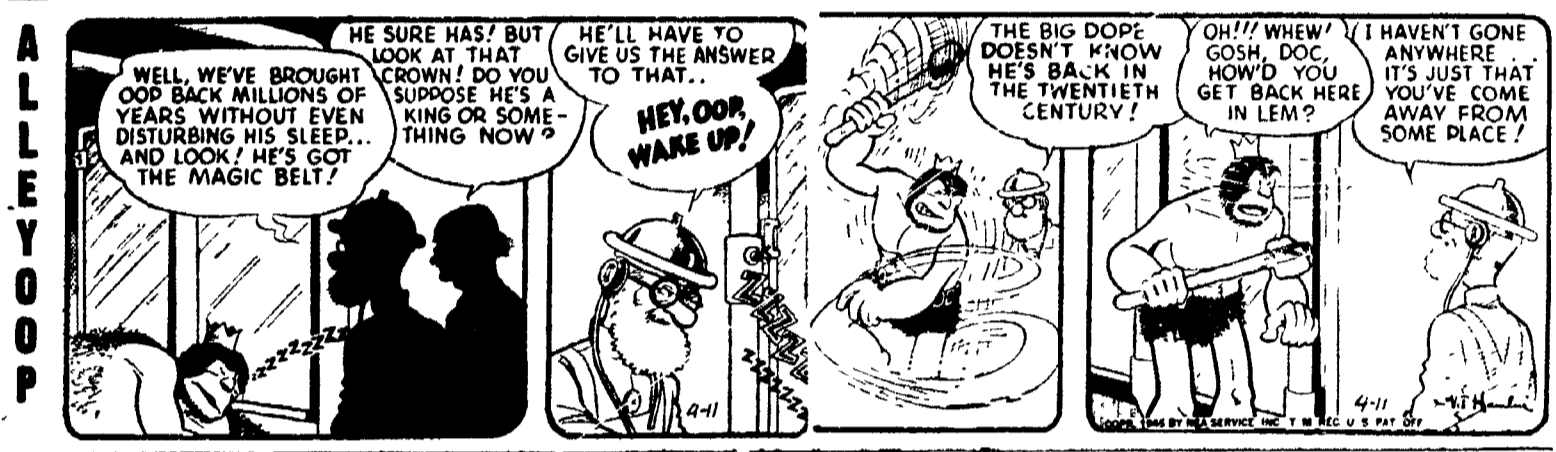
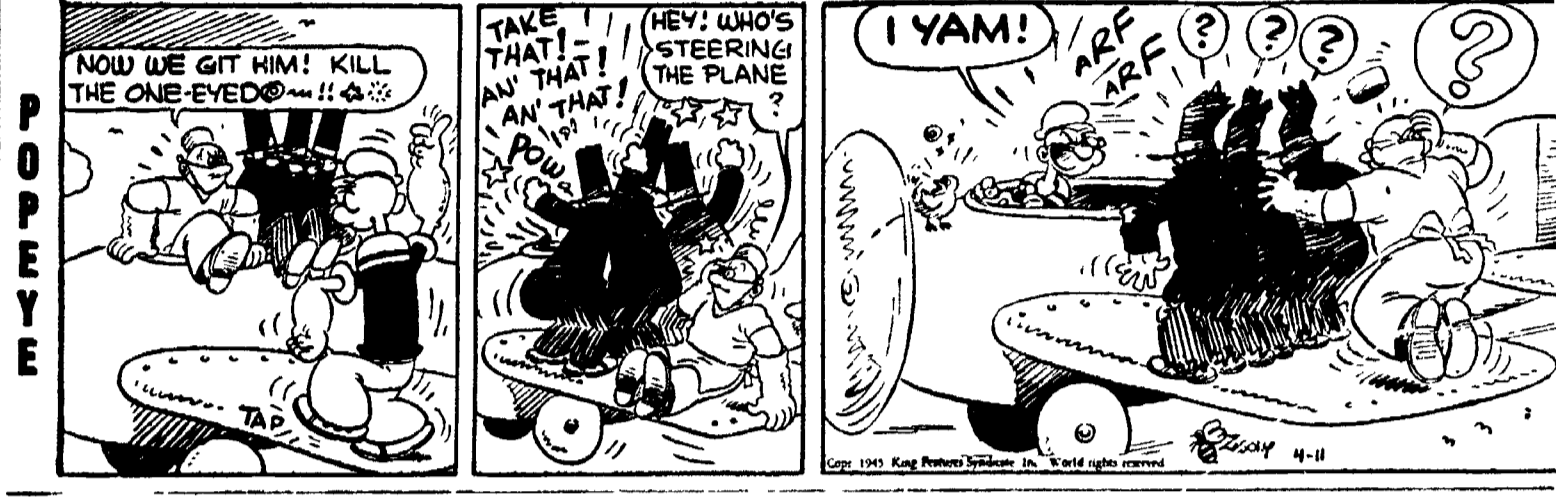

O'Brien was wounded on the sixth day of the invasion by shrapnel when a Jap hand grenade exploded 10 feet from him.
