PROPOSES NATIONAL HOLIDAY ON JAN. 30

WASHINGTON, Apr. 14—(AP)—Designation of Jan. 30, birthday of the late President Roosevelt, as a national holiday was proposed in legislation drafted today by Rep. Gallagher (D-Minn).

Gallagher also called for creation of a national shrine at the Warm Springs, Ga., cottage—the "Little White House"—where Roosevelt died.
