During the present century, candlefish oil has come on the market as a substitute for codliver oil. For its size, a candlefish has far more oil than a codfish.

The flesh of the candlefish is valued as food. The flavor is pleasant, though oily. There is

pleasant, though oily. There is, however, a trouble about frying a candlefish. The housewife finds that after it is heated in the skiller for a short time, much of the fish disappears. It melts into oil! Candlefish are closely related to smelts, and are small cousins of salmon. Like both smelts and sal-mon they leave the sea and go upstream in rivers to lay eggs. Smelts are of some importance as food fish. They are to be found

in the Atlantic from the Virginia coast to points above Nova Sco-tia. There are smelts in the Pacific ocean, in much the areas as the candlefish. The North sea provides many of those which appear on the table in Great Brit-


